A Message from the Coordinator of Family Ministry ...

Well, today's readings certainly bring us face to face with the question, "How much do I trust God to provide all that I need?" From Elisha's servant, to Philip and Andrew, to all of us sitting in the pews, we are good people who want to trust the Lord, but when push comes to shove, we often rely more on ourselves and our own understanding, than on our God. When we think it's all up to us, and we don't bring our needs to the Lord, it's down the rabbit hole we go. Fear, worry, anxiety, frustration and even pride and self-righteousness come flooding in. And the more we try to control everything, the greater a hold those life-draining tools of the Evil One have on us. The challenge is real. Trusting God is difficult; but absolutely necessary, to deepen our personal relationship with the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

But how can we come to trust God more readily? Just re-read the responsorial psalm for some practical tips! Give thanks! Bless the Lord! Talk about the glory of God! Speak of God's power and might! Look hopefully to the Lord! And wait for your due season! I know...I know...I know...easier said than done. I hear you.

Remember the old adage, "Practice makes perfect!" I heard those words so many times when I was a child attempting to learn a new skill. But I have come to learn, all too well, that practice does NOT make perfect. However, it certainly does make things more comfortable, less intimating and more natural. Developing our trust in God is no different. The more often we seek God's will and trust in Him for the little things that we need, the more it becomes a habit, "our way of doing things," and the more connected to His Heart we become.

I am always so encouraged when I ask someone if they can get involved in something, and they respond, "Let me pray on it and I'll get back to you." I am reminded by responses such as that, that I should always be "discussing things with God" before I make decisions. Is my discernment always on the money? Nope! But the more I seek God's voice, the more I find it. When I do mishear or misunderstand Him, He always meets me where I am, and works with me to correct the course.

For me, somehow it seems easier to trust God for the big things that I know I have no control over; but trusting Him for EVERYTHING requires the acknowledgement that EVERYTHING comes from Him and that I am merely an unworthy recipient of His amazing generosity and love. Pretty humbling...

but in many ways, pretty liberating too! How is it liberating you ask? Jesus tells me to come to Him like a little child. Little children just "expect" that the grown-ups will meet all their needs. They don't wrestle for control (except of course during "the terrible two's" and all of adolescence!). Children just come and allow themselves to be taken care of by the people who love them. They expect great things. They believe the sky's the limit. Of course five barley loaves and two fish will feed everyone... why wouldn't it?!! Perhaps that's why they're so happy and carefree, and they laugh and smile so much more than adults do!

Recently, we had our Vacation Bible Camp here at St. John's. We had 86 campers and more than 60 youth volunteers (middle school and high school students from our parish). Talk about carefree, and smiling children. Thev EVERYWHERE! What a fabulous reminder of who we are...Children of the Living, Loving God! Each morning the children came with open minds and open hearts, excited to see what God had in store for them. They trusted that all their needs would be met. They marveled at how something relatively simple became extraordinary, exciting and fun. Imagine if each of us started our days that way? There's no telling how our lives would change! Our Vacation Bible Camp taught all of us about the many ways that God is our friend and we are challenged to deepen our friendship with the real God... the God who loves us and the God we can trust! The children embraced those teachings. They shouted God's praises every day. They sang and danced of His love. They prayed and laughed and smiled. And we have proof! There are awesome photos in this week's bulletin and on our parish If you need something to make YOU smile...take a peek! I guarantee you'll feel the joy of the Lord!

So friends, let's accept St. Paul's challenge to "live in a manner worthy of the call we have received, with humility, gentleness and patience, bearing with each other in love." Let's try to trust our God more and more each day! Let's try to relinquish the control and the stress that goes with it! Let's expect Him, and allow Him to meet our needs, and then some. And let's do it with the happy-go-lucky trust of children!



A Message from Msgr. Walden...

At times, we joyfully share who we are and what we have generously. At other times, we are slower because we are preoccupied with situations beyond our control. In the Gospel for today's Mass (John 6:1 -15), we see Jesus miraculously feed 5000 people with five loaves of bread and two fish. That truly is miraculous and in that effort, Jesus, once again, clearly reveals His Sacred Heart of compassion, love, and mercy. He never reached the point where He felt, "I did enough!" Never in the Gospels do we find Him running away from demands or people because He was too tired or did not get the response He hoped for. His Sacred Heart is an inexhaustible source of love, mercy, wisdom, and compassion. That is exactly the love we all need personally and communally as the human race.

Where is God and His love and truth in the world we live in? God is not "out there". He is in every heart that finds the longing that only He can fulfill. That is a reality that only comes to light whenever we allow Him into the depths of our being. The people in our hearts and minds go with us wherever we are. The are "just there" whether we are consciously focused on them or not. God is always conscious of us because He loves us. Just as those in our hearts energize, inspire, and sustain us, so, as we are clearly reminded in today's Gospel, we energize, inspire, and sustain Jesus in His love for us. How can we become more aware and sustained by this reality of faith? The key is not to spend all day in prayer or in church, but to find that time everyday when we can pray and reflect silently, and be open to the light of God's love. Jesus said very clearly in the last words of St. Matthew's Gospel (28:19-20): Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age."

Yes, we are ever in His heart. Every time I reflect on His words on the cross, I am overwhelmed by His mercy and love. Even those who crucified and had no time or use for Him were the center of His prayer: "Father forgive them, they know not what they do." (Luke 23:34). He has same love for each one of us. How good it is when we allow Him and

His love to go from His heart into ours! We have many challenges and situations to deal with personally and in all the



things going on in our nation and in our world. Clearly, the heart of Jesus we all live in is not at the center and core of our thoughts, words, and actions as a nation or even in our homes at times. Is it naive and childlike to even hope for that? "At that time, the disciples approached Jesus and said, "Who is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven?" He called a child over, placed it in their midst, and said, "Amen, I say to you, unless you turn and become like children, you will not enter the kingdom of heaven. Whoever humbles himself like this child is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven. And whoever receives one child such as this in my name receives me." (Matthew 18:1-5). How blessed we are when we realize, like all children do, we are in the hearts of those who love us. How blessed we are when we truly believe we and everyone else is in the heart of Jesus. How blessed we are and how joyful and hopeful we become when we humbly thank Jesus because we are a brother, and sister, and mother to him: "And stretching out his hand toward his disciples, he said, "Here are my mother and my brothers. For whoever does the will of my heavenly Father is my brother, and sister, and mother." (Matthew 12:49-50)

I close with three verses of the beautifully simple song, "Open My Eyes".

Open my eyes, Lord Help me to see Your face Open my eyes, Lord Help me to see.

Open my ears, Lord Help me to hear Your voice Open my ears, Lord Help me to hear.

Open my heart, Lord Help me to love like You Open my heart, Lord Help me to love.









SJE Safe Environment Updates...

All volunteers and employees at SJE are required to be registered with VIRTUS and complete a background check every 5 years. Depending on when your registration and last background check was completed, you may be receiving an email message from the Virtus system which will advise you of the need for an updated background check and the message will also include a link to Sterling, the third-party company that partners with Virtus to complete the process. As part of the process, you will have to enter your Social Security number, just as you did when you first completed your registration. By entering your Social Security number, there will be no cost to complete the check. If you do not enter your SSN, there will be a fee of \$95 which is required by NY State for a database/record search without the use of a SSN. Please check the appropriate box indicating if you wish to enter your SSN, if you do not, the system will ask for your Credit Card information for additional billing purposes. Please know that the Sterling site is a safe site for you to enter your personal information. You may also be asked to complete a review of a Code of Conduct at that time if you have not already done so.

REMINDERS FOR ALL VOLUNTEERS. All SJE employees and volunteers must wear their SJE badge while on campus and serving in ministry. Please also check your email regularly to complete monthly updates. (Be sure to check your "spam" or "Junk" folder too.) Please reach out if you have any questions or need assistance with any part of the Virtus registration process.
