A Message from Fr. Felix....

A little act of charity can bring good things to our life. The bible says charity covers

a multitude of sins. I want to share with you two acts of charity in the old testament Genesis chapter 18: 1-12 and 2ndKings 4:8-11, 14-16a.

One day Abraham was sitting at the entrance to his tent during the hottest part of the day. He looked up and noticed three men standing nearby. When he saw them, he ran to meet them and welcome them, bowing low to the ground. He did not know these men at all. This is how he greeted them: "My Lord," he said, "if it pleases you, stop here for a while". The

men continued to rest under the shade of a tree while water was brought to wash their feet. Abraham exclaimed, "Since you have honored your servant with this visit, let me prepare some food to refresh you before you continue on your journey". "All right", they said. "Do as you have said". So Abraham ran back to the tent and said to his wife Sarah, "Hurry! Get three large measures of your best flour, knead it into dough, and bake some bread". Then Abraham once more ran out to the herd and chose a tender calf and gave it to his servant, who quickly prepared it. When the food was ready, Abraham took some yogurt and milk and the roasted meat, and he served it to the men. As they ate. Abraham waited on them in the shade of the trees.

Then they asked him, "Where is your wife Sarah?" "She is in the tent", he answered. One of them said, "Nine months from now, I will come back, and your wife Sarah will have a son". Fortunately, Sarah was listening to this conversation from the tent. At this point in time Abraham and Sarah were very old, and Sarah was long past the age of having children. Her immediate reaction was to laugh silently to herself and said, "How could a worn-out woman like me enjoy such pleasure, especially when my husband and I are so old?". They asked Abraham "why did Sarah laugh? Why did she say, can an old woman like me have a baby?" One of them said "is anything too hard for the Lord?".

From the Sunday first reading (2nd Kings 4:8-11, 14-16a)



One day Elisha came to Shunem. where there was a woman of influence, who urged him to dine with her. Afterward, whenever he passed by, he used to stop there to dine. So she said to her husband, "I know that Elisha is a holy man of God. Since he visits us often, let us ar-

range a little room on the roof and furnish it for him with a bed, table, chair, and lamp, so that when he comes to us he can stay there". Sometime later Elisha arrived and stayed in the room overnight.

Later Elisha asked, "can something be done for her?" His servant answered, "Yes! She has no son, and her husband is getting on in years". Elisha said "call her". When the woman had been called and stood at the door, Elisha promised, "This time next year you will be holding a baby son".

The woman and her husband were in complete agreement to have Elisha, the man of God, in their home. Both of them worked together and trusted one another; above all, they had great respect for the man of God. Abraham was the one serving his guest while his wife Sarah and the servant were preparing the meal. These two incidence and many others in the bible should teach us the values of almsgiving, generosity, caring for one another, and serving those in need promote spiritual strength among Christians. Please remember this and reflect on them. "Gold and silver provide security, but good advice is better. Wealth and strength give confidence, but the fear of the Lord can give you even greater confidence. When you fear the Lord you need nothing more; it is all the support you need. The fear of the Lord is like a rich garden of blessings; you could not want a more glorious shelter". (Si 40:25-27).

Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

2 Kgs 4: 8-11, 14-16a | Rom 6: 3-4, 8-11 | Mt 10:37-42

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

In today's first reading, the Shunammite woman recognized that Elisha was "a holy man of God." She and her husband then went on to provide Elisha with hospitality and lodging, and she was rewarded with a son. But how did she recognize Elisha as the holy prophet that he was? Recognition, or lack of it, is a recurrent theme in Scripture - from Mary Magdalene not recognizing the risen Lord at the tomb to the disciples not recognizing Jesus on the road to Emmaus. In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus himself encouraged his listeners to learn to recognize "false prophets" because they bear bad fruit. What do we need to open our eyes to and recognize today? Perhaps the realization that Jesus' life and teachings always point us to life - life with him and in him, on earth and for eternity. As members of the body of Christ, let us ask the Holy Spirit to fill us with his love so that we may bear good fruit and always choose the road that leads to that life.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

"Whoever finds his life will lose it, and whoever loses his life for my sake will find it." Perhaps we should consider these words from Jesus in today's Gospel a challenge. Yes, we know that faithful discipleship comes with demands. But "losing our life"? I like to think of it as going "all in" in our response to Jesus. Investing the most we can in our relationship with Jesus means recognizing that he is the way and the truth and the life. And then we must act upon that. How? Put God first in your life. Serve him before all else. Let our relationship with Christ be like the frame that holds a building up – let it define us, strengthen us, and shape us. And may it allow us to recognize his loving presence in each moment of our lives.

ACTION The summer months are hot in the northern hemisphere, and traveling, running errands, and doing things for one-self can be difficult for those who are adversely affected by the heat. Take a look around you - at your neighbors or even those who are part of your daily circle of encounters - and be intentional at recognizing who they are (a child of God) and what their needs might be. Offer specific assistance to them related to that need, as the Shunammite woman and her husband did for Elisha.




