A Reflection on the Gospel: Mark 6:1-6

"A prophet is not without honor except in his native place and among his own kin and in his own house."

Faith is the fuel. Without it, the engine has nothing to work with. Faith isn't based on what we know by way of the flesh, but by way of the Spirit. It develops not from the outside, but the inside.

Many of those in Jesus' native place were 'tapping the wrong spring,' because they were relying on 'externals' to guide their thinking. They weren't allowing their hearts to see into God's Kingdom, because their heads were stuck in their own town. The townspeople were looking at Jesus through a local lens, which confined their thinking, and stifled their belief in something bigger.



Familiarity can often breed contempt. Sometimes, in order for things to come into focus, we must hold them further from our eyes.

Our Parish Outreach programs provide essential food programs that nourish families, especially those needed during the summer months.

Summer is a wonderful time for youngsters who long for fun-in-the sun activities and a break from the school year. Unfortunately for many families, summer can mean months of worry and hunger, as kids lose access to healthy meals given at school. Food insecurity is real on Long Island. According to LI Cares, more than 200,000 families, almost 70,000 children, do not have access to sufficient food, or food of an adequate quality, to meet one's basic needs. As parents juggle the ongoing rising costs at the supermarket, gas pumps, housing, utilities and medical co-pays, they turn to the Parish Outreach to find relief.





A Message from Msgr. Walden...

The news is full of the thoughts and plans of those who are running for public office, especially about who will be elected the next president of our nation. Who will it be? Who will elect him? What consequences does that have for those who vote for him? It is not my job nor do I have the authority to tell anyone who to vote for. My place in the Church as a priest is to offer the Sacraments, pray for and with those who I serve, and to do everything I can to get myself and everyone I can to heaven. We certainly have many challenges to deal with in our world and nation today. As advanced as we are in our "knowledge" and technology, we must be astute with the vision of our faith which calls us to look not only at where we are and what we are responsible for, but to recognize we are on a journey to eternity. The arrival at our final and eternal destination is far more than a place, it is the fullness of God's loving presence in heaven.

Growing up in the 1950s there was a much greater emphasis on sin and hell than we have today. I guess you can say in many ways the thoughts expressed by our teachings in the Church were to "scare the hell out of us." Today, we hardly ever mention hell or think about it. But it is a reality (read Matthew 25:31-46). Jesus pulls no punches and is straightforward about what gets us to heaven and what condemns us to hell. Our society today revels in promoting free choice and promoting selfdesires, even those that ruin or take the lives of The key is to see what is harmful to others. ourselves and our nation and to do all we can to find the path of peace in our relationships by living who we are as human beings created out of love in the very image and likeness of God (Genesis 1:27).

So the questions we all will face is not only how much good we have done and how faithful we have been in living in the image and likeness of God, but also how unfaithful we have been in supporting those who openly support, promote, and legalize evil. One of the greatest sins and evils in our nation is abortion. Everyday more and more courts expand What does that mean to us as its availability. Catholics on the road to eternity? How can we justify voting for anyone who openly, vigorously, and powerfully does everything possible to make abortion a legal choice. Be assured while it is a legal choice, it is a mortally sinful choice. Evil certainly has a strong foothold in our government (elected officials) at this point in the life of our country. If government officials we elect openly promote this abominable evil, what consequences does that have

for those who vote for them? We can fool ourselves by looking at other issues, but government that legalizes abortion cannot be trusted to always do the hard, right,



good, and moral thing. Sacrificing the most vulnerable among us, a position we were all in as we lived in our mother's womb, leads to the darkness and suffering of hell. I might sound old-fashioned, but I look to the light that leads to heavenly glory, not the fire light of hell. I condemn no one, but offer the light of truth to those my priesthood touches.

I close with these inspiring words from Psalm 139 and its prayer in the breviary:

Happy the man whom you teach, O Lord, whom you train by means of your law; to him you give peace in evil days while the pit is being dug for the wicked.

The Lord will not abandon his people nor forsake those who are his own; for judgment shall again be just and all true hearts shall uphold it.

Who will stand up for me against the wicked? Who will defend me from those who do evil?

If the Lord were not to help me, I would soon go down into the silence.

When I think: I have lost my foothold; your mercy, Lord, holds me up. When cares increase in my heart your consolation calms my soul.

Can judges who do evil be your friends? They do injustice under cover of law; they attack the life of the just and condemn innocent blood.

As for me, the Lord will be a stronghold; my God will be the rock where I take refuge. He will repay them for their evil wickedness, destroy them for their evil deeds. The Lord, our God, will destroy them. Glory...

Psalm Prayer: Lord Jesus, you taught your disciples not to fear the world. Do not abandon your inheritance to sinners, nor ignore the power of the enemy against the Church. Grant us always to seek the wisdom of the cross and the blessing of those who suffer for the sake of justice. May we always be filled with your happiness. Amen. 



SJE Safe Environment Updates...

All volunteers and employees at SJE are required to be registered with VIRTUS and complete a background check every 5 years. Depending on when your registration and last background check was completed, you may be receiving an email message from the Virtus system which will advise you of the need for an updated background check and the message will also include a link to Sterling, the third-party company that partners with Virtus to complete the process. As part of the process, you will have to enter your Social Security number, just as you did when you first completed your registration. By entering your Social Security number, there will be no cost to complete the check. If you do not enter your SSN, there will be a fee of \$95 which is required by NY State for a database/record search without the use of a SSN. Please check the appropriate box indicating if you wish to enter your SSN, if you do not, the system will ask for your Credit Card information for additional billing purposes. Please know that the Sterling site is a safe site for you to enter your personal information. You may also be asked to complete a review of a Code of Conduct at that time if you have not already done so.

REMINDERS FOR ALL VOLUNTEERS. All SJE employees and volunteers must wear their SJE badge while on campus and serving in ministry. Please also check your email regularly to complete monthly updates. (Be sure to check your "spam" or "Junk" folder too.) Please reach out if you have any questions or need assistance with any part of the Virtus registration process.
