A Message of Faith and Courage ...

As America celebrates its 247th birthday, it finds itself in a tumultuous period of time. It has sadly become common to hear people say that America has been damaged to the point of no return. When hearing this, it can be easy to succumb to feelings of doubt and hopelessness. But much like any other period in human history, those grounded in faith are best equipped to see the hope waiting on the other end of this challenging time. The better we know the word of God, the easier it will be to conquer challenges.

It is human nature to want things to go according to plan. And while we should always strive for consistent happiness, peace, and success, God also tells us that there will be trials and tribulations throughout the course of life. Numerous Bible passages reference them occurring as a matter of when, not if. We are not called to submit to these things, but to fight through them. Historically, Americans have embodied this fighting spirit, but societal influences have led many to submit to fear and intimidation. While disheartening to witness, it is understandable why so many feel this way.

Our society has created an environment that discourages both independent thought and standing up for what is right regardless of potential resistance. Both things directly contradict the example Jesus Christ set for all of humanity.

Matthew 7: 13-14 states: Enter by the narrow gate, since the road that leads to destruction is wide and spacious, and many take it; but it is a narrow gate and a hard road that leads to life, and only a few find it.

Romans 12:2 reads: Do not model your behavior on the contemporary world, but let the renewing of your minds transform you, so that you may discern for yourselves what is the will of God -- what is good and acceptable and mature.

In other words, framing our thinking and actions based on what the Bible promises as opposed to societies' standards will lead to a more fulfilling life. When these two things begin to contradict one another, we are called to stand firm by taking the road less traveled. This is not an easy task by any means, and only a small portion are willing to take that step due to fear of ridicule, backlash, and falling victim to the newest toxic societal trait: cancel culture.

Constant negative actors want us to feel ashamed of how God made us, the situations we were born into, and our past both personally and as a nation. Many mischaracterize Jesus by alleging he was a pacifistic, B-type personality who merely blended into the background, never ruffling any feathers, hoping we become that way. The result is a timid and fearful society that enables government to infringe on the rights of its people without much resistance.

This can be a daunting realization to come to, but this is actually where we can best test our faith and prove to ourselves and God that our confidence in him is stronger than our fear of earthly obstacles. God wants us to have abundant life, and overcoming challenges is the most direct path to achieving that. Mark 10:14 and John 2:17 reveal another element of Christ's true character: righteous indignation. They use the words indignant and zeal to describe him in certain instances. And in John 2:15, it is said Jesus made a whip to drive out those who had turned his house of prayer into a bandit's den, and even flipped over tables. If Jesus set the example for us all to follow, would we not also be permitted to feel a sense of righteous indignation when we see evil deeds taking place?

There are so many parallels between the biblical times mentioned above and today, but of course this is not a coincidence. The passages we read are literal in that they occurred, but also metaphoric in that they repeat themselves in modern ways for all of us. This is by design. While no sacrifice will ever be greater than the one Jesus made for all of humanity, we can take solace in knowing any struggle we meet when pursuing a righteous cause is a microcosm of the persecution he faced.

1 Peter 2:16 says to live as free people, and not to use freedom as a cover-up for evil. Unfortunately, we see so much evil by societal leaders that infringes on individual freedoms but is masqueraded as being done for "the greater good." Jesus' crucifixion stemmed from actions such as standing up for the truth during a time in which the "powerful" in society were telling him he couldn't. Would anyone dispute that we are seeing numerous examples of this today?

America is not officially a Christian country, but the founding fathers made sure to refer to the days they were living in as "the year of our lord." Their actions showed they had a personal faith in God. Liberating people from an oppressive foreign ruler requires many things, but none of these can be accomplished without first having a faith and belief that God will lead the way. It is indisputable that the founders fought the good fight, finished the race, kept the faith, and were strong and courageous due to a belief that God was with them. They did not declare the nation a Christian one, but their actions, which birthed America, were rooted in Christian values. There is nothing stopping us as individuals from having that same perspective. In fact, we are entitled to it.

Bad actors are always responsible for their actions, but bystanders play a key role in enabling bad causes to bear fruit. The book of Revelation warns us about God's view of the lukewarm, and we must always keep our guard up to prevent ourselves from falling asleep in our faith. So, as we celebrate the birthday of the greatest nation on earth, now is the perfect time to gain a new, recharged perspective. A perspective of faith and freedom to begin boldly and bravely to stand up for righteous causes. This period of time presents an incredible opportunity, perhaps better than any other due to all that is taking place. There are a number of verses that we can relate to, but one most fitting for present time we are living in is Deuteronomy 31:6. "Be the strong and courageous. Do not be afraid or terrified because of them, for the LORD your God goes with you; he will never leave you nor forsake you." God bless America!
