# A Reflection from Deacon Michael Hoonhout... 19th Sunday in Ordinary Time

The saying goes, "there is no place like home," and we all know the feeling of peace and contentment that comes over us when we get home after a long trip or a hard day at work. "Home is where the heart is" is another popular saying, and the way we decorate our homes to reflect our personal tastes and fill them with pictures of our family shows that the home is the heart's resting place. And yet...many of us have a second home to get away from our first, and others have a boat or like to go camping in order to get away from where our heart generally wants to be. Our home is very dear to us, but not quite enough to satisfy our hearts at all times. This deep truth—that our hearts will only truly rest in God's Kingdom-is the theme of this week's Gospel.

Hopefully by now you have learned that each time you pursue something more in this world, your heart is not going to remain satisfied. It won't be long before you get tired of what you have and want something different. Since the heart's deep desire always for more, more, MORE!!! cannot be quenched in this world, we need to embrace St. Augustine's famous spiritual maxim: "Our hearts are restless until they rest in you, O Lord." Though many unspiritual people think religion, and Christianity in particular, is about suppressing desires, the exact opposite is true: we are called to desire more than this world has to offer by "lifting up our hearts" to want what God has promised us in the life to come.

Listen to the way today's second reading from Hebrews describes how the Patriarchs Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob sought what lies beyond this world because of their faith in God's promises:

They did not receive what had been promised but saw it and greeted it from afar and acknowledged themselves to be strangers and aliens on earth, for those who speak thus show that they are seeking a homeland. If they had been thinking of the land from which they had come, they would have had opportunity to return. But now they desire a better homeland, a heavenly one. Therefore, God is not ashamed to be called their God, for he has prepared a city for them.

Have you ever acknowledged that you too

are a "stranger and alien on earth"? You are as a believer, a descendant of Abraham our father in faith, for faith is forward looking and, like Abraham, we have to be one who seeks the promised land. To be a follower of Christ is not to be one who is always padding one's own nest or building bigger barns. Our true home is heaven, and we need to let heaven be our treasure, "For where your treasure is, there also will your heart be."

In the Gospel, Jesus teaches us that we have to be expectant, waiting, prepared, ready, looking for that sudden and unexpected day when He will return and reward those who truly lived for His promises. There are two things we can say with absolute certainty about the Second Coming of Jesus Christ: the day is definitely going to come, and it is going to come when we are not expecting it. So we must be vigilant and watchful, living each day knowing his return is as definite as it is definitive. But we are not expecting to wait in fear. No, we are called to wait with longing. The best way to prepare is to grow each day in your desire for heaven, for it alone is our heart's true home.

Well, begin with changing your expectations about what this world can offer. Remember as Christ says this world's treasures wear out: worldly wealth is lost eventually to moth, rust, or thief. Accept that the things of this world are going to fail to satisfy, so that instead of becoming exasperated by life's disappointments, you let them spur you to prefer the higher things of God. Most of all, discover how beautiful, how desirable, how wonderful God truly is. Be mindful of how transcendent and all-surpassing God is in His unfathomable mystery, and then look at Jesus Christ, who "for our sakes became poor, although he was rich" (with a divine greatness beyond measure), "so that by his poverty" (the abasement of his suffering and death) "we might become rich" (cf. 2 Cor 8:9). Fall in love with Jesus more each day and you will find your true treasure. Only then will your heart deeply long for heaven as your true home.

# A Message from Msgr. Walden...

One of the great marvels of this point in our lives in the twenty-first century is AI, artificial intelligence. I have seen two, almost unbelievable things through it. The first was when a priest was asked to say prayer at an inauguration of a politician. He verbally told the program on the computer what the situation was and boom! Within thirty seconds there was a wonderfully-Catholic prayer a page long for the occasion. The second time I was actually part of being transported by AI. I met with group of men to go to a golf outing in Syosset. We met in a parking lot in Smithtown and put our clubs in the cyber truck of one of the men in our foursome. We got in the truck and the driver said, "Watch this!" He programmed the truck to drive us to the golf course in Syosset and it did so without him touching the steering wheel, brake or gas pedal through rush hour traffic the whole way.

As we live our lives everyday, we take another step to our final destination, eternal life in the fullness of God's presence forever in heaven. This is not a hands-off journey that tells us to sit back and enjoy the ride. It is a gift just to be alive and to experience who and what we are as human beings. Not only do we have the gift of life, we have the gift of faith that illumines our path everyday. While we are not conscious of who and what we are and where we are ultimately going every step everyday of our lives, the gift of faith is the much needed light that gives us hope, direction, inspiration and strength to stay on the path that brings peace.

These past weeks the first reading at the Masses during weekdays have recounted the escape of the Jewish people from slavery in Egypt, and how God guided them and miraculously fed them each day with manna in the morning and quail at night. The key was for them to only take what was needed for the day and trust that God would do the same day after day, which He did. They frequently complained, but God with His loving patience

remained faithful to His promise to feed them. Of course, the real nourishment was God's faithful love,

mercy, presence, and providence. Our daily journey through life presents us with untold messages, ideas, and situations to deal with. It is the same God who guided the Jewish people through the desert who guides us with His ever-loving presence. The key is to carry Him in our hearts as He carries us in His. Daily prayer where we "turn off" and put aside everything and everyone vying for our attention is a most nourishing encounter, as well as the gift of Jesus Himself in Holy Communion at Mass. Jesus was never distracted or discouraged in His earthly presence among us. Then, as now, He is ever present to our thoughts, words, and concerns. We have far more than artificial intelligence or human ingenuity. We have the loving, merciful presence of Jesus who brings us totally into His

I close with this passage from St. Paul's Letter to the Colossians 3:12-17:

life with the Father and Holy Spirit, His Mother

Mary, and all the angels and saints.

Put on then, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, heartfelt compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience, bearing with one another and forgiving one another, if one has a grievance against another; as the Lord has forgiven you, so must you also do. And over all these put on love, that is, the bond of perfection. And let the peace of Christ control your hearts, the peace into which you were also called in one body. And be thankful. 




