A Message from Deacon Michael Hoonhout...

During August, we continue to hear the Bread of Life discourse from the sixth chapter of the Gospel of John. In today's Gospel, Jesus resumes his dialogue with the crowd that had witnessed his multiplication of the loaves and fishes. In this Year of Eucharistic Revival, we too listen to what Jesus says about himself as the Bread of Life in order to deepen our faith in His great gift of Himself in the Eucharist.

The Gospel describes the crowd murmuring about what Jesus said at the end of last week's Gospel, that He is the true Bread from Heaven. They object to his claim that he is from above because they know his human origins. They murmur because what Jesus says seems to contradict what they see. They see an ordinary man of a certain age born of a mother and raised by a father, just like every other human being. Remember, Jesus did not glow or have a halo around his head. Yes, he had just worked a miracle in multiplying the loaves and fishes, but wonders were done by Moses and the prophets and none of them were "from heaven." All of them were born like anyone else, ordinary men that God had chosen to use to accomplish His works. Jesus is making an extraordinary claim, and to believe it to be true depends entirely upon taking His word for it. Its truth cannot be determined by human senses and reason. What He says is not supported by how He appears. And whether Jesus' words are credible or not rest entirely upon who He is. Only if He preexists his birth into this world can His words that He is "from heaven" be true.

Now all of this applies to us and the approach we take towards the Eucharist. We can murmur to ourselves that we know the origins of what we see in the Eucharist: it is bread and wine that has been brought up from the people and offered to the priest. The prayer of blessing over these gifts even explicitly says that it is bread from the earth and fruit of the vine. All of this is true because we see it with our own eyes. And the Eucharist continues to appear, unchanged, as bread and wine. Just as the contemporaries

of Jesus saw a man, and their senses did not deceive them because Jesus was truly human, so too do our eyes not



deceive us when we look even upon the consecrated Host and see bread, or when we receive the Host and taste bread. The appearance of the Eucharist as bread and wine is real, for that is its sign — exactly how Jesus chooses to appear to us. This sign, this appearance, need not be denied, because the Eucharist is a sacrament, and a sacrament is always an invisible mystery under a visible sign. In the Eucharist Jesus wants to appear as bread because He wants to feed us with Himself.

Though the crowd in the Gospel were not wrong in saying that Jesus had human origins and was truly a man, they are being invited by Iesus to have faith in His word that He is from heaven. To know that this is true requires faith in what He says, a willingness to trust Him because of who He is. This faith is a gift given by the Father, not an achievement of human reason or a logical deduction. Faith is how we are taught by God. We need this same faith before the Eucharist. Not denying what we see and taste, nevertheless we recognize that the Eucharist is Bread from Heaven. We believe this because we put our trust in Jesus because of who He is, and by faith we accept as true what He says: This is my Body ... this is my Blood. While the world may say, "seeing is believing," the Gospel truth is: "believing comes from hearing." Again, no one could see or sense that Jesus is from heaven; they had to take His word for it. Same with us. None of us can see or sense that the Eucharist is the true Bread from heaven. We have to take His Word for it. And we do so, because, taught by God, we believe in who Jesus says He is.

When we approach the Eucharist with this faith that Jesus is from heaven, then in our consuming the Host we can "taste and see the goodness of the Lord." And when we consume the Eucharist weekly, if not daily, then we will have the strength we need in our pilgrimage to heaven. The "journey will not be too long for us" because heaven already comes to us when Jesus is our true bread.





Grieving is a natural process each of us goes through after the death of a loved one. While no one can take


away our sadness, others can help by listening and caring. Sharing our feelings with others who have experienced the death of a loved one help many people begin the healing process.




A Message from Msgr. Walden...

It is one thing to seek to win at any cost and quite another to seek to love at any cost. To love at any cost is to seek only to do good, to be faithful to truth, and to seek the reconciliation. True inner peace comes when we do what we can and are at peace with that. Our words are not, "I told you so", but the message that Jesus' words always communicated "I will never stop loving you." As much as we are challenged to surmount the desire to win or to get even, we have these unbelievable words of Jesus in the ultimate injustice and suffering on the cross, "Father, forgive them, they know not what they do." (Luke 23:34)

can only find peace and reconciliation without compromise of absolutely essential: is faithfulness to Jesus Christ who is the Way, Truth, and Life. To deny or ignore Him is to know deep within our being that things are not right. To seek to live with peace in our hearts can never happen as long as we do not embrace Jesus by welcoming Him into our minds and hearts. How foolish it is to say to ourselves, "I've got this" and basically forget about Jesus and His presence in our lives. At that point we accelerate faster and faster into unrest, anger, hatred, and perpetual tension in our hearts.

At the end of his second letter to Timothy (4:14-17), St. Paul related an experience that caused him unrest and gave us an example of how to go on with peace and purpose that is both life-giving to him and everyone else


he deals with: "Alexander the coppersmith did me a


