FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

St. Maximilian Kolbe, Mary, and Mission

TO THE MAX

Dear Parish Family:

St. Maximilian Kolbe, whose feast day is celebrated on August 14th, is the patron saint of drug addicts. He is a saint I admire tremendously. Not only do many of the clients I work seek his intercession, he selflessly offered his life for the sake of another.

When a husband was about to be sent to his death by starvation during the Holocaust, then-Father Maximilian willingly took his place. While with the other prisoners being starved to death, Fr. Maximilian endured – praying, standing, kneeling. After two weeks, only he remained alive. Finally, he was given a lethal injection and died. When he was canonized by Pope St. John Paul II the man whose life he saved was present at the celebration.



Long before St. Maximilian was involved in the tragedies of the Holocaust, his devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary marked his life as a young boy, man, and priest. As we celebrate the Solemnity of the Assumption, St. Maximilian's devotion to Mary is worthy of prayer and consideration from each one of us. He knew that turning to Mary cannot be a turn only to Mary. Not at all. Rather, we turn to Mary in the hope that we can draw closer to her Son. Someone shared with me this quote attributed to St. Maximilian, "Never be afraid of loving the Blessed Virgin too much. You can never love her more than Jesus did."

It is that utter humility and reliance on God alone that strikes me this weekend. We celebrate a "Return to Mass" weekend as the dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass is lifted for those who are well enough to do so. We celebrated a beautiful Marian procession reminding us of the many opportunities we have to turn to Mary here at SJE. We celebrate Spirit Day at Night bringing the Body of Christ together following a beautiful bilingual liturgy. What is common is that all of these movements is we are turning away from ourselves and focusing on and consistently renewing our relationship with Christ and His Church.

Isn't that what Mary does in the Sunday's Gospel? (The reading at the Saturday evening Mass is a different reading.) After visiting Elizabeth, couldn't she have just gone into all that had happened to her over the past weeks—the Annunciation, the journey to Elizabeth, Joseph—and so much more? Not at all. She simply utters this incredible hymn of praise. The Magnificat is the Gospel Canticle we pray every night during Evening Prayer. Here we join the Church in rejoicing in God our Savior. Mary's focus is on her relationship with God. He has brought her to this moment. He will bring her where she needs to go. The same is true for you and for me.

In remembering the great things God has done, how can we not attempt to imitate this greatness? How can we not try to have "mercy" lift "up the lowly", scatter "the proud" and live out this great prayer of praise in our own lives. I am in awe of the many ways this happens here at SJE. In quiet and humble ways, Mary's prayer of praise is a good description of much of the work we do. It is a work we do not for our honor or glory, but we do it to "proclaim the greatness of the Lord."

I was working with a young person from the local community this week. I do not know him well. I met him a few weeks ago. He was wearing a medallion of St. Maximilian Kolbe. I asked him to tell me about it. He didn't know much about St. Maximilian, but he knew his patronage. He told me that a friend in recovery gave it to him. He said to he had heard great things about this saint and hoped that this saint would pray for him and keep him on the right path. No doubt he does for this young man as he turns to Mary who turns to her Son for him and for each one of us!

St. Maximilian Kolbe, pray for us!





The Solemnity Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary

AUGUST 15, 2021

What is the Assumption?

The first name of this solemnity was the Feast of Mary, Mother of God. Later, its name in the East carried over, the Dormition (or Falling Asleep) of Mary. In the West, it became known as the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary.


This solemnity celebrates the fact that Mary's Assumption is "a pledge of the future participation of the members of the mystical Body of Christ in the paschal glory of the Risen Christ." It shows that the Lord "reserves a munificent reward for his humble Servant because of her faithful cooperation with the divine plan, which is a destiny of fullness, happiness, glorification of her immaculate soul, her virginal body, perfect configuration to her Risen Son" (Directory, no. 180). The Mass has a proper vigil, and the solemnity replaces the Mass of the day when it occurs on a Sunday in Ordinary Time.

What does this all mean?

On November 1, 1950, Pope Pius XII declared the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, which the Church celebrates every year on August 15. Simply put, the dogma of the Assumption states that at the end of her life, the Blessed Virgin Mary was taken, body and soul, into Heaven.

While this event isn't reflected in Sacred Scripture, it is clearly part of the Church's earliest observance. In the sixth century, St. John Damascene wrote in one of his sermons, "Your sacred and happy soul, as nature will have it, was separated in death from your most blessed and immaculate body, and although the body was duly interred, it did not remain in the state of death, neither was it dissolved by decay; your most pure and sinless body was not left on earth, but you were transferred to your heavenly throne."





THE SOLEMNITY ASSUMPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

Theologically speaking, death is often understood to be a consequence of original sin. Since Mary was conceived without Original Sin, some theologians have wondered if Mary died or if perhaps she was taken into Heaven without experiencing death. The Catechism of the Catholic Church doesn't answer this question but simply states, "The most blessed Virgin Mary, when the course of her earthly life was completed, was taken up body and soul into the glory of heaven" (no. 974)

The Solemnity of the Assumption reminds us of the unique role that Mary served in the process of our salvation. Although she was without sin, we have the possibility of receiving God's forgiveness for our sins through Christ. Her entry into Heaven prefigures our own hope of experiencing the same eternal life.

Ordinarily, the celebration of the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary is a holy day of obligation for Catholics, but when it falls on a Saturday or a Monday, that obligation to attend Mass is lifted.








Year of Saint Joseph Book Study




