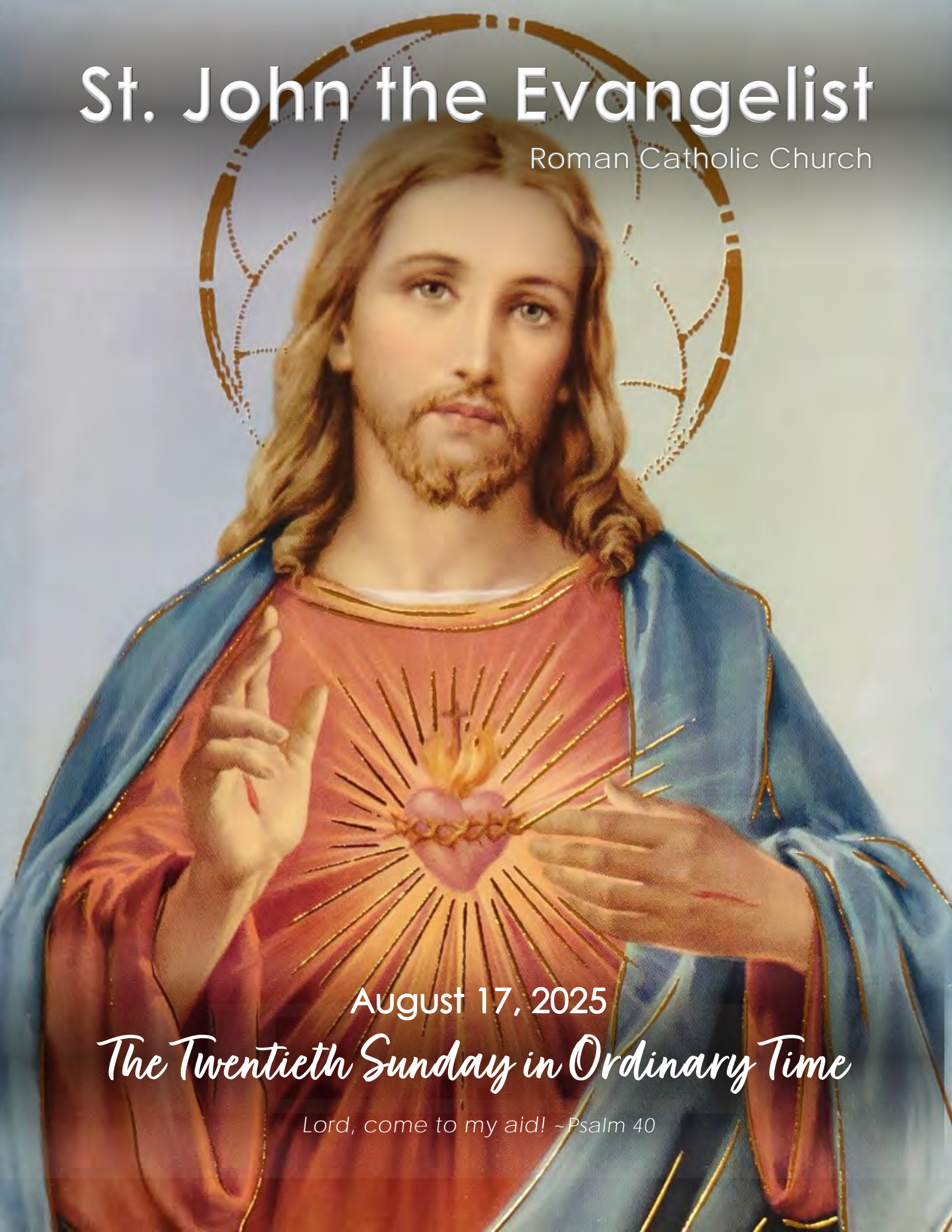

A Message from our Pastor, Fr. Patrick...

Gospel Reflection ~ Luke 12:49-53 ~ "Spreading the Love of God"

We are so blessed to have the scriptures in our lives today. They are our blueprint for happiness and our pathway to wholeness. They help us grow in holiness and humility. In general, the scriptures redirect our attention back to God and His commandments. But even more importantly, they reassure us of our greatest hope—new and everlasting life. They lead us to a greater conversion of heart. God's Word is transforming! They remind us of God's complete love for humanity.

In addition, what inspires me the most about the scriptures is their relevance in our lives today. Jesus uses images and situations that we can easily identify with. In today's gospel, He reminds us of the division that exists within our world and relationships today. No different now than during the life of Jesus! He speaks about the importance for peace that gets lost in society. He reminds us today, as He did in the world back then, that He has come to set the world on fire. A purifying fire. The fire of God's love. How He wishes it were already up in flames!

Unfortunately, however, the pathway to peace is not always easy. If we accept Christ's teachings, we will be opposed and ridiculed by those who reject it. Harmony between God and humanity through reconciliation is the ideal. It is the Christian standard we should adhere to. We all have to make a choice between what is easy and what is right. It is never easy to say or do the right things when society says otherwise. This is why we need the scriptures because the scriptures lead us to peace, true inner peace. We all know what is right and wrong. Yet, for the sake of compromising "short-term peace", we often neglect our Christian responsibilities and turn the other way. We turn our backs on difficult situations instead of taking care of a situation. Confrontation is not easy, especially when truth is involved.

And in today's gospel, Jesus is challenging us. In order for peace to prevail in our hearts and within our lives, sometimes we need to say what is right, even if in the short term we experience division. I am always sad when I hear how families are divided, especially over little things. What is missing in our society is humility and our understanding and appreciation of God. God would never ask us to do anything that was not essential or important. He knows the way to peace and shows us the way through the scriptures, especially in the area of forgiveness. Jesus came into our world to show us the Father's love and to ignite this love. And all we have to do is respond to this love and remain in His love, in hope that others will do the same. Hopefully, we can be an extension of our Lord's ministry and join Him in "setting the world on fire," in spreading the love of God to all in our world today.



Parish / Summer Update

I hope that you all are having a nice summer with your families. During the last week of July, I spent the entire week with my family at the Jersey Shore. Each year we spend this week together. It is always fun being together. We love and cherish this time of the year at the Jersey Shore with one another. I also went to Pittsburgh, PA the week after with my close friend, Daniel. I love the city of Pittsburgh. It is a "mid-western like" city tucked inside and surrounded by the Appalachian Mountains. It is so neat driving through a tunnel inside a mountain and coming out and seeing the whole city of Pittsburgh surrounded by mountains with a beautiful skyline and bridges with three rivers flowing through.

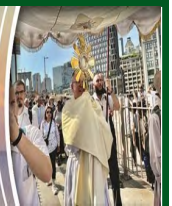

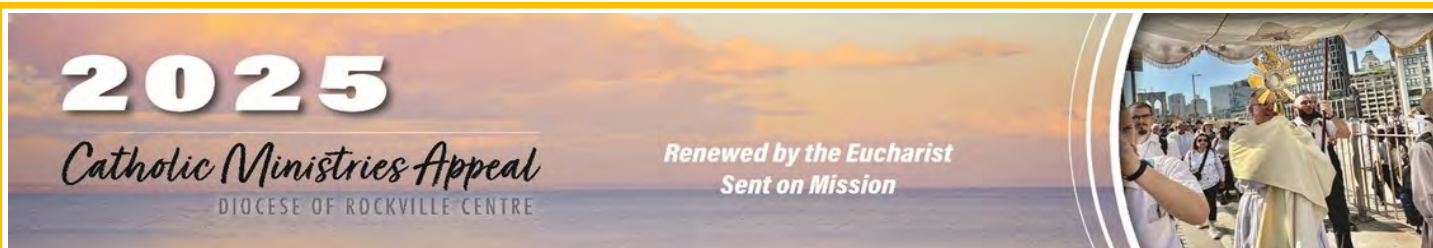

Our Moms on the Journey group gathered on July 23rd. We took advantage of the delightful summer evening and met on the Convent Porch. After a lovely time of fellowship and feasting, we explored our identity in Jesus and the need to recognize ourselves not only as moms, but as daughters of the Righteous King. We dove more deeply into the beauty and blessing that our true identity brings. We discussed our tendencies to “beat ourselves up” over our relative shortcomings and our seemingly never-ending quest to be “supermoms”. We shared about our need to embrace our imperfections, forgive ourselves and walk in gratitude and dependence upon the Lord. We reflected individually on our need to let go of certain things, attitudes, judgments that weigh us down and distract us from who we are in Christ. After jotting them down we went to the foot of the cross and tossed our burdens into the flame of forgiveness. Those burdens remained as ashes, unrecognizable and unable to be picked up again, symbolic of our true hope to be freed from the fears, worries and anxieties that often render us both helpless and hopeless. The moms found it liberating and transformative and all reported a feeling of “lightness” and peace after our exercise. It was truly a beautiful evening. And to top it all off, we were joined by Fr. Charline, who served as a mentor, spiritual director and friend for our entire evening! What a blessing for all of us!

Thank you Lord for the gift of the beautiful, faith-filled mothers in our parish. Strengthen them, guide them and help them to accept Your mercy and unconditional love! Amen

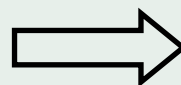

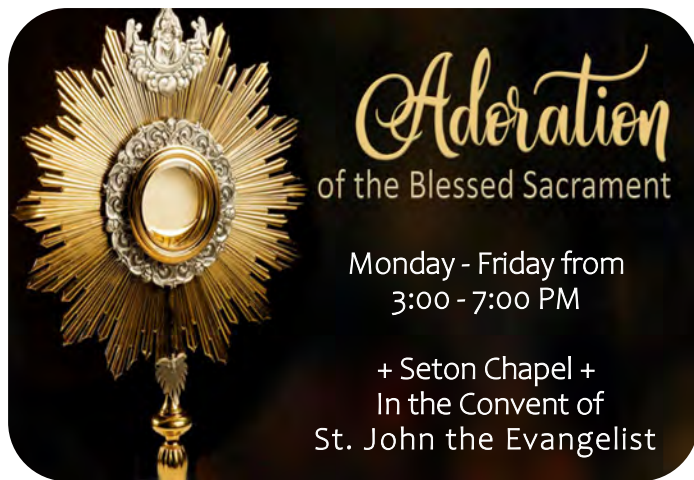

A Message from Msgr. Walden...



One of the greatest gifts we all seek in our lives and in our world is peace: personal, family, national, and international peace. Why does the desire for peace run into so many obstacles? As we reflect on the readings for today's Mass, we see those who seek to bring the peace, love, and truth of God's love being rejected. In the first reading the prophet Jeremiah is thrown into a muddy cistern to die because his opponents do not want to hear what he has to say. In the second reading we have these words from the letter to the Hebrews: "Consider how He (Jesus) endured such opposition from sinners, in order that you may not grow weary and lose heart." In the Gospel Jesus for today Jesus says, "Do you think I have come to establish peace on the earth? No, I tell you, but division."




The peace we all seek is not the absence of war, conflicts, or disagreements. It is not the tolerance we can muster to just get along or the mental maneuvering to avoid confrontation. It is the peace Jesus preached about and lived with all those who encountered Him. It is the peace that suddenly lit up the minds and hearts of His disciples as he appeared to after He had risen from the dead. In Luke 24:36-49, Jesus appears to His disciples after His resurrection, "But they were startled and terrified and thought that they were seeing a ghost." But as He spoke with them, they were filled with joy, the joy only true peace, mercy, and love can bring. It is only the presence of Jesus and our embrace of Him that opens the way to inner peace, hope, and love.

We are not competitors or conveniences on the journey of life, but human beings created in the image and likeness of God. We will only find peace when we get to the point St. Thomas reached when his doubts were erased as he was invited by the Risen Christ to touch His hands and side: "My Lord and my

God" (John 20:28). As we look at our lives in the light of God's love, we surely have many things to be grateful for. We did not ask to be born and we hope to love forever in peace. That is not just a pleasant thought or wild hope, but the very reality that our faith in God brings us. God's love is a fire that purifies our minds, hearts, and desires, takes us out of ourselves, and makes our lives fuller and richer than they could ever be otherwise. When there are disagreements or rejection, the key is not to allow them to make us spiteful or vengeful. We cannot put out the fire of God's love in our hearts and find true peace. As we pray everyday for our personal intentions and those we love, we express our hopes, gratitude, and love. Every Sunday we gather as a parish and with the Church throughout the world with the same intentions. May we become sources of peace and rise beyond being obstacles to ourselves and others.

I close with these words of Jesus from the Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5:43-48). They are challenging but open our minds and hearts to His love for us and His patience with us.

"You have heard that it was said, 'You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy.' But I say to you, love your enemies, and pray for those who persecute you, that you may be children of your heavenly Father, for he makes his sun rise on the bad and the good, and causes rain to fall on the just and the unjust. For if you love those who love you, what recompense will you have? Do not the tax collectors do the same? And if you greet your brothers only, what is unusual about that? Do not the pagans do the same? So be perfect, just as your heavenly Father is perfect."
