A Message from Deacon Michael Hoonhout...

20th Sunday in Ordinary Time

As the month of August unfolds, our Sunday Gospel continues to be taken from the Bread of Life discourse from the sixth chapter of the Gospel John. And we continue to reflect on Jesus' words in this year of Eucharistic Renewal. Let us recap what has happened so far. The chapter began with Jesus feeding a great crowd of thousands from five loaves and two fish, and there was more left over than with what He had started. The next day, the crowd came looking for Jesus because he satisfied their hunger, but Jesus told them to desire the food that gives eternal life. He then begins to teach them about this food by saying that He is the true bread come down from heaven, the Bread that the Father gives, which gives life to the world. The crowd, murmuring about this claim, questioned how Jesus, a true man, could have come down from heaven. Jesus not only repeats the claim but greatly adds to it: "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world."

In this Sunday's Gospel, the Jews progress from murmuring to quarrelling by objecting: "How can this man give us his flesh to eat?" It is a reasonable question, for what Jesus says seems scandalous. Before looking at how he responds, let us appreciate the wisdom of the evangelist in describing the buildup in the reaction of the crowd from murmuring to quarreling. For unless one stops murmuring about Jesus' first claim and believes that Jesus has come down from heaven, one will never be able to accept the second claim that the bread that Jesus gives is his own flesh. He gives the true heavenly bread that gives eternal life because He is the eternal Son of the Father sent from heaven to give life to the world.

How Jesus responds to the quarrelsome objection of the Jews is worth pondering. First of all, in this whole discourse Jesus never does answer their exact question about how he will give his flesh. The answer to "how" is given at the Last Supper, when Jesus takes the unleavened bread of the Passover, declares it to be His Body given for us, and as it retains the appearance of bread, gives it to his disciples to eat. Instead of explaining how, Jesus only focuses on making it absolutely clear what he is saying. He knows that what he is saying does seem objectionable, so he seeks to remove all doubt about what he is saying.



In his actual response to the Jews, Jesus repeats three times, "eat my flesh and drink my blood."

Secondly, Jesus never pacifies the objecting crowd by softening what he is saying or explaining that he is speaking only symbolically (as he does at other times in the Gospel - cf. John 3:6; 4:13-14; 11:11-14). Instead of using a term that can be interpreted symbolically, soma (Greek for "body"), he uses a graphic word with a clear literal meaning: sarx (Greek for "flesh"). For the verb "to eat," he switches from the more general and possibly symbolic word phagon to the more graphic and literal tragon, meaning "to chew" or "gnaw". To remove all doubt, Jesus speaks clearly and plainly: "For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink." And as we shall hear in next week's Gospel, when many of his own disciples could not accept that Jesus was commanding them to eat his flesh and drink his blood, Jesus allowed them to leave him rather than change, water down, or explain away his teaching.

While there ought to be no doubt about what Jesus is teaching, still it is helpful to grasp how He gives us his flesh to eat and his blood to drink. But we will save that for next week, the final installment from John 6. What Jesus does at the end of this Gospel is to explain why He wants to give us His Body and Blood as our true food and drink. The bread that He gives is his flesh because only such food can: 1) raise one from the dead on the last day; 2) cause one to live forever; 3) give eternal life. Ask yourself, can bread that is "Jesus" only in a symbolic sense do all that? But the bread that is Jesus' true flesh can do all that because: 1) Jesus rose from the dead in that very flesh; 2) Jesus lives forever in that very flesh; 3) Jesus is the co-eternal Son of the Father. When one believes Jesus and receives the Eucharist knowing that it is truly His flesh and blood, then "one who feeds on me will have life because of me." No symbolic bread can do this, for only Jesus Himself can truthfully say, "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him."





A Message from Msgr. Walden...

"Brothers and sisters: watch carefully how you live, not as foolish persons but as wise, making the most of the opportunity, because the days are evil. Therefore, do not continue in ignorance, but try to understand what is the will of the Lord." These words were written over 2000 years ago by St. Paul from to the Ephesians, part of the second reading at Mass today. We can sum up these words and see how relevant they are today as the day they were written by humbly and joyfully allowing Jesus to love us and bring us into His life with the Father and Holy Spirit. Love is never earned, it is a pure gift to receive and a pure gift to give. Joy comes when we are grateful to be loved and love others in return. Jesus did not come to set straight but joyfully, courageously, us and vulnerably give Himself to us and invite us into His life here and now, and to bring us to share eternity with Him. Through Him, we come to see that we enrich, enliven, and fill each other with joy and gratitude through, with, and in Him. Yes, there are hesitancy, challenges, fear, anger, and misunderstandings at times. Jesus never gave up living and loving with hope that we would accept and be enriched His love, mercy, wisdom, and presence. How beautiful the opening words from today's Gospel (John 6:51-58): "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world."

To let others into the depths of our being is to be enriched, challenged, and open to who they are. Jesus was not readily accepted by the world He lived in. Yet He remained faithful to who He is and what He came to do. To love is to take the risk of opening who we are in the depths of our being to others. At times there is disappointment, misunderstanding, and the temptation of get defensive and protective as we turn in on ourselves. In the love Jesus has for us as we open our hearts in gratitude and we see true wisdom, goodness, and holiness. The opposite of wisdom is falsehood and foolishness. The opposite of goodness is evil. The opposite of holiness is sinfulness.

Living in the light of faith with Jesus as our bread of life does not prevent challenges or guarantee peace and mutual respect and acceptance. But a strong faith, founded on Jesus the Bread of Life, enables us to be all God has created us to be and to live through, with, and in Him. It is a leap of faith to allow Jesus to give life to us and, even more, to believe He gets life and love from our presence in His life. Without Him, there is always someone more than




something missing. We cannot exhaust His love and mercy. Jesus is ever hopeful, welcoming, open, and available to us. The result of the leap of faith is that we become one with Him and through us His love, light, mercy, and wisdom brightens the lives of all He entrusts to our care.

I offer Psalm 84 that I prayed from the breviary last Monday. It is about God's temple and our presence in His life and His presence in our lives.

> How lovely is your dwelling place, Lord, God of hosts. My soul is longing and yearning, is yearning for the courts of the Lord. My heart and my soul ring out their joy to God, the living God. The sparrow herself finds a home and the swallow a nest for her brood; she lays her young by your altars, Lord of hosts, my king and my God. They are happy, who dwell in your house, for ever singing your praise. They are happy, whose strength is in you, in whose hearts are the roads to Zion. As they go through the Bitter Valley they make it a place of springs (the autumn rain covers it with blessings). They walk with ever growing strength, they will see the God of gods in Zion. O Lord God of hosts, hear my prayer, give ear, O God of Jacob. Turn your eyes, O God, our shield, look on the face of your anointed. One day within your courts is better than a thousand elsewhere. The threshold of the house of God I prefer to the dwellings of the wicked. For the Lord God is a rampart, a shield; he will give us his favor and glory. The Lord will not refuse any good to those who walk without blame. Lord, God of hosts, happy the man who trusts in you! Glory ...

Psalm Prayer: Bless your people, Lord. You have given us the law that we may walk from strength to strength and raise our minds to you from this valley of tears. May we receive the gifts you have gained for us.


