

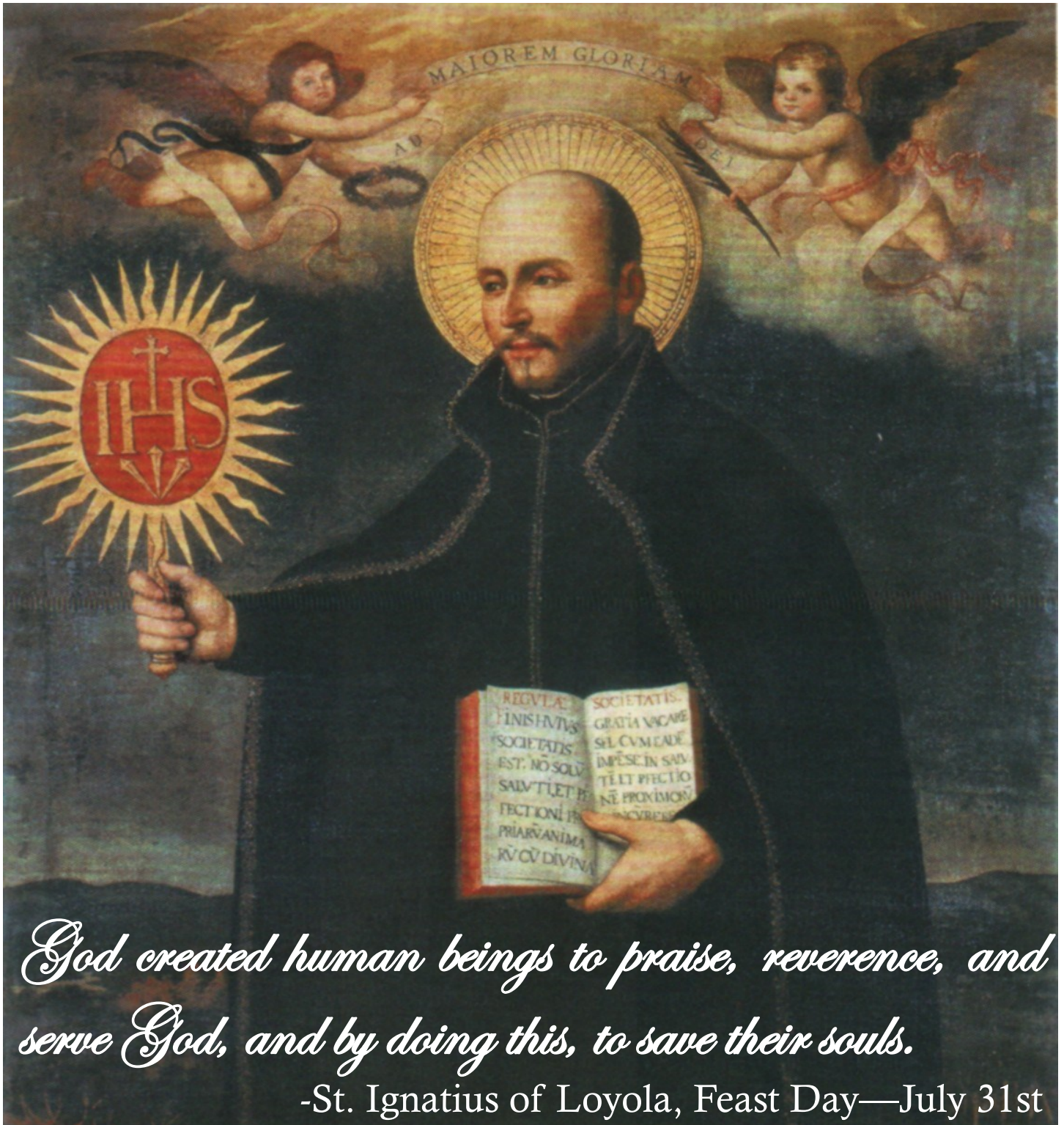

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Deeds More Than Words

TALK IS CHEAP

Dear Parish Family:

"It is well to remark two things: the first is that love ought to be put more in deeds than in words. The second, love consists in interchange between the two parties; that is to say in the lover's giving and communicating to the beloved what he has or out of what he has or can; and so, on the contrary, the beloved to the lover. So that if the one has knowledge, he give to the one who has it not. The same of honors, of riches; and so the one to the other."

Ignatius

On July 31st, the Church celebrates the Feast of St. Ignatius of Loyola, the founder of the Society of Jesus. It's a pretty big year for St. Ignatius as the Church celebrates the 500th anniversary of his conversion. (You have seen some things written here and you can read more about St. Ignatius and the Ignatian Year here—<https://www.drvc.org/>

IgnatianYear).

You can probably pick up from my writing and preaching (and hopefully my person) that I have a great appreciation for St. Ignatius, particularly *The Spiritual Exercises*. My encounters with them in spiritual writings and eventually in an extended 30 day retreat transformed (and transforms my relationship with Jesus and the Church). I shared the last part of *The Spiritual Exercises* above. After a long experience of prayer, silence and reflection the one who has completed the retreat reads the above before completing the Contemplation to Attain the Love of God. More on that another time.

This part of *The Spiritual Exercises* resonates in a particular way this weekend. At most of our Masses, a member of one of our parish social ministries (outreach ministries) will speak about getting more involved in one or more of these ministries. As our social ministries continue to grow and the needs of others comes before us, we need more parishioners to love "in deeds more than words" in any way you are able.. You can tell from the reading of these pages of the bulletin that there are many ways to be involved in the social outreach work of the Church—from making a meal, offering prayer, donating clothes and items, volunteering to assist with everything from chickens to coat sorting, and so much more!

Why do we do this? Because we are loved and because of that love must love one another. Isn't that the "interchange" St. Ignatius writes about? First, we must remember we are the beloved of God. This is our identity (and the only one we need, for that matter). Because we are the beloved of God, we MUST in "giving and communicating to the beloved what he (she) has or out of what he (she) has or can". If everything we have received is a gift from God, how can we not offer that gift to others, most especially the poor?

This consideration needs to be part of our work as we pray with the sixth chapter of the Gospel of John. Each week we hear about Jesus, the Bread of Life. This must inform our prayer, our participation at Mass, and our understanding of Real Presence. Of this, again, there can be no question.

If we really believe in the gift of the eucharist and what it calls us to become then going forth as the Body of Christ to be the presence of God for others is a no-brainer. How we do that will be different for each one of us. For some of us we commit to pray, other prefer to work "behind the scenes" while others of us can do more physical work and are able to be on campus more easily. Whatever way you can be the Body of Christ for others is what you and I need to do.

One thing—you probably know this too—is serving the other as a response to God's love for us often helps us to put things into perspective. How easily we can caught up in our own "stuff" like the Israelites in the first reading. Loving the other forces us to move out of ourselves and helps us to put things into right order of priority. Second, when we are able to touch the life of another in whatever way we can we are often more touched by that love than we could ever imagine.

So take some time this week to consider how you might love more in deeds than words in every aspect of your life and then consider if that love might be able to become a greater part of our parish's story of love for one another.

St. Ignatius of Loyola, pray for us.

Please, if you can, say a prayer for me.

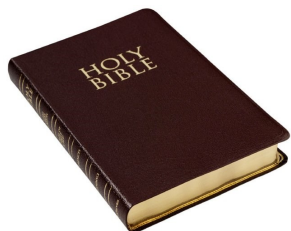
Grandparents' Ministry/Support Group

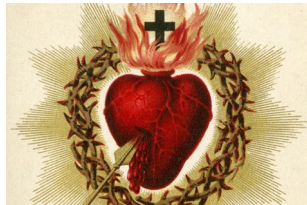
