### REBUILD + REPAIR + RESTORE

Each week, we will try to provide updates about the rebuilding of the Church, the renovations in the Convent and the updates to the Auditorium as we continue to rebuild, repair and restore our Church community.

### THE CHAPEL OF ST. ELIZABETH ANN SETON

I hope, I hope, I hope that this week we will begin using the Chapel of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton for Daily Mass. As of this writing (8/15), we are on schedule for this. Seton Chapel will become the place where we celebrate Daily Mass, have Eucharistic Exposition on Thursdays and pray our Monday devotions (when we do not have Summer Evening Prayer) until we return to the Church building. Over the past few weeks, we have made some minor renovations that will make the space more comfortable, expanded the Chapel space and improved the floors by restoring them. In the next few weeks, we will paint Seton Chapel but this will be able to happen while we are using the space.

In the weeks ahead, new chairs will arrive and we will make some other adjustments that will enhance the space.

I cannot thank everyone enough for their patience in these weeks. We did not anticipate this project taking as long as it has taken. As I wrote a few weeks ago, we learned about some different issues that needed to be addressed in the convent building. While the timing has been a little frustrating, this process has helped us to improve the convent on many levels for the future.

### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

# OF RELIGION AND RACE HEARING VOICES

Dear Parish Family:

I do not know about you, but I have been pretty overwhelmed (and exhausted) from hearing about all that has happened in our country since the incidents in Charlottesville, Virginia last week. There are a lot of voices—political, racial, social - from a lot of places speaking loudly. I've tried to take some time this week to listen to the voices of some of the teachers of the Church, the bishops (in italics below).



We all must raise our voices in condemning the vile acts that have taken place, and also standing in solidarity and union with those who are speaking out in their communities..." -Archbishop Wilton Gregory, Archdiocese of Atlanta

As Catholics, there should be a deep wrenching in our hearts whenever we hear of acts related to racism and discrimination. For the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* states: "The equality of men rests essentially on their dignity as persons and the rights that flow from it: 'Every form of social or cultural discrimination in fundamental personal rights on the grounds of sex, race, color, social conditions, language, or religion must be curbed and eradicated as incompatible with God's design'" (1935). If we really believe the Church's teaching in the dignity of every human being—and it's not just a slogan or a pious statement we make—then we should be filled with a holy anger of sorts that inspires us to pray for justice and to do what we can to curb and eradicate racism. There is no option to look the other way here.

"If our anger today is just another mental virus displaced tomorrow by the next distraction or outrage we find in the media, nothing will change. Charlottesville matters. It's a snapshot of our public unraveling into real hatreds brutally expressed; a collapse of restraint and mutual respect now taking place across the country... If we want a different kind of country in the future, we need to start today with a conversion in our own hearts, and an insistence on the same in others. That may sound simple. But the history of our nation and its tortured attitudes toward race proves exactly the opposite."

-Archbishop Charles J. Chaput, Archbishop of Philadelphia

It is pretty easy for me to look at Charlottesville from not only a physical distance but an emotionally safe one that says to me, "Well, that's their problem...glad it's not an issue for me." And, if I say that, I am a liar. Because the reality of racism, like any sin, is that it is often insidious. How often do I look down on people with a different skin color or different way of life than mine? At times, can I avoid being with certain "kinds" of people, even categorizing them by their race or religion or orientation or gender and failing to see the other as a child of God too? Or do I share a joke based on a certain skin color or ethnicity or even pass it on to my children? How quickly do I rush in my heart to say things like "It's my country" or even to have the audacity to call other humans —with the same dignity as me—by their immigration or legal statuses? Maybe you do the same some times? Maybe you justify it like I do and convince myself that I do other good things. This just might be a blind spot. Well, last Saturday reminds me that I have a lot of work to do in these areas, a lot of work. Maybe we all have some work to do. If we do not start from within, we have no ground to stand on when it comes to insisting on the conversion of others.

"The violence in Charlottesville did not develop in that moment or in one day. Rather the seeds of Saturday's tragedy had been planted long before, going back far in the history of our nation. We can look upon last Saturday's tragedy with a sense of great sadness and defeat. Or we can look at these events with the vision the Paschal Mystery brings us - a vision of healing, a vision of new life." - Bishop John O. Barres, Diocese of Rockville Centre.

The events of Charlottesville and the reactions of so many have weighed on me this week. I find myself defeated and saddened for our country and fearful for what might come next. Yet, if I am a disciple of Jesus and belong to the Church, I have to see with the vision of the Paschal Mystery—moving from places of death to new life even in what has been so dark and despairing. Let's pray that as we gather as Church, as we

hear readings this week that remind of us our God who is here for all nations that we might listen to His voice and "observe what is right and do what is just" (Isaiah 56:1).

# TOTAL CONSECRATION TO THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

## **Beginning Sunday, September 10, 2017**

Total Consecration to Jesus through Mary is the *quickest, easiest, surest, most perfect way* to become a saint according to St. Louis de Montfort, author of the spiritual classic, *True Devotion to Mary*. Pope St. John Paul II made the consecration at the age of 18 and described it as *the decisive turning point of his life*. Don't you want *that*?

Join the parish community of St. John the Evangelist in making the total consecration to Jesus through Mary. The program will start on September 10<sup>th</sup> and conclude on October 13<sup>th</sup>. Why October 13<sup>th</sup>? October 13<sup>th</sup> is the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Miracle of the Sun during the centenary year of Our Lady's apparitions in Fatima, Portugal. At Fatima, Our Lady promised that, "*In the end, My Heart will triumph.*" I don't know about you, but with the world as crazy as it is, that promise of Our Lady is pretty comforting and reassuring! Why not let Her triumph in your heart and your life?

That's where it has to start!

We will be using the book, 33 Days to Morning Glory, by Fr. Michael Gaitley, MIC. It only takes an open heart to the Lord and a few minutes each day to make your spiritual life never be the same again. The consecration consists of 33 days of preparation leading up to the consecration day itself. You can either do this self-guided retreat alone, with your family in your house or with others from the parish who are making the consecration after the 12pm Mass every weekday and Sunday and the 8am Mass on Saturday morning. There will be a special Mass on October 13<sup>th</sup>, in which those who are making the consecration may do so together as a parish community.

The parish will provide the book, 33 Days to Morning Glory, for free to those who are interested in participating. (A free will offering may be made but there is no expectation.) You can email Father Michael, stop by the Rectory or see Fr. John, Fr. Michael or one of our sacristans after Sunday Mass.



### **SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION - Confessions**

At St. John's we celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation every day. During the week, we celebrate the sacrament after the 7 a.m. and 12 Noon Masses. Generally, the priests will be in the "living room" or the Chapel area of the Convent. He will wait or be around for 10 minutes after the last person has come. If Daily Mass is held in the Auditorium, the priest will be seated some place in the Auditorium after Mass.

On Saturday and Sunday evenings, confession are heard in the Youth Ministry Office (near the Main Entrance of the Auditorium) or in the back of the Auditorium itself.

With all of our movements in these weeks, we don't want to lose our commitment to and celebration of the sacrament of Reconciliation. (Of course, you can - and should approach one of our parish priests whenever you want to celebrate the sacrament.)
