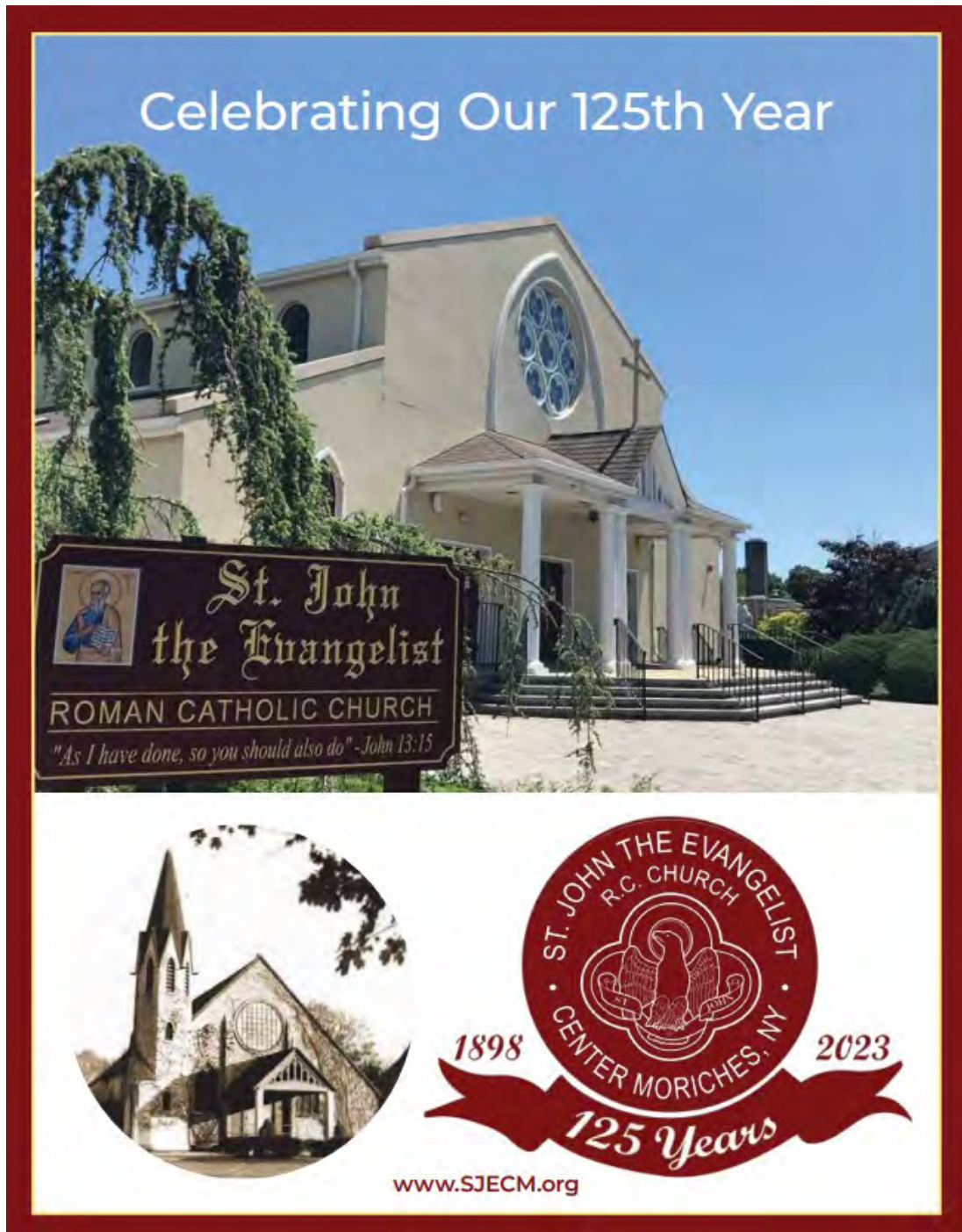

A message from our Pastor, Father Patrick...

Gospel Reflection (MT15:21-28) & Parish update



It is clear in His encounter with a Canaanite woman that Jesus' love for humanity is real and universal. His love for all is sincere and complete! Even though this woman was not of Jewish origin, Jesus, up to this point in His ministry, was coming to the fuller realization and understanding that His mission was to serve all and to love all; to destroy all barriers of division and to unite us together as one with God. No one is excluded from God's love. It is clear from the Infancy Narratives that Jesus came to us that first Christmas night not just as the Jewish Messiah but as the Universal Messiah.

It is clear in today's Gospel that the Canaanite woman, born of Gentile origin, came to believe that Jesus was the Son of God. She knew of His Lordship and His ability to heal. It was her knowledge and her faith in Jesus that led to His full response in healing her daughter of all of her afflictions and demons. She had the foresight and knowledge of the universality of His love, when many did not.

Today, the Canaanite woman serves as an icon and model of the Church reassuring the world once again of the Lord's desire to save and heal. She reminds the world that Jesus' love for all is complete and universal. She shows us that it is through an openness of heart that one can encounter the living God through Jesus and be restored to wholeness. She reminds us that it is our faith in God, and our faith in God alone, that leads us to freedom. In order to stay connected to the Lord and receive His countless blessings, one has to grow in prayer, faith and appreciation of His authority to heal and forgive. Matthew says elsewhere that to say we know the Lord is not enough for salvation! One has to be humble before God and believe in the Lord in order to be redeemed!

What Jesus does in today's Gospel is radical. It is revolutionary because He showed the world that those outside the Jewish faith and those who seek healing and forgiveness can be saved too; that the lost sheep of Israel include all of God's children who turn to Him in faith. It includes all who come to believe in Him over a period of time.

Today's encounter with the Canaanite woman allows us to see the world as God does. It gives us another opportunity to rejoice in the Lord, knowing of His redemptive power. Today's Gospel story reminds us that the Lord comes to redeem us and free us of our afflictions. He comes to save us from the power of darkness and lead us to new and everlasting life. The truth is we do not have to look too far to grow in our faith and understanding of the Lord. All we have to do is turn to Jesus and believe knowing of His complete love and concern for us. He reaches out to us whenever we are in need of healing and cleansing.

On Tuesday, August 1st, Fr. Louis Cona, former pastoral year seminarian here at St. John the Evangelist, led us in our 125th Anniversary closing mass on the front lawn of the convent. It was such a beautiful celebration under the clear blue twilight skies. It was wonderful to see so many of you come out to join us in celebrating 125 years of parish life and ministry. It was wonderful to see a great representation of our parish family attend. To see so many of you from all the different ministries and liturgies that we offer here at St. John's was truly amazing and uplifting! The mass intention was for our parish family and loved ones. **I want to personally thank the 125th Anniversary Committee** for their assistance throughout this past year. Starting last summer, they worked very hard to make this year very special and memorable for all of us. There were many different events, reflections on the history of our parish and liturgical celebrations offered each month in commemoration of this historic milestone.

I hope and pray that you are having a peaceful and restful summer with your families. During the last week of July, I was able to join my family at the Jersey Shore for our annual beach vacation. It was so much fun to spend time together as a family. Please know that you and your families are in my thoughts and prayers every day. I plan to take the next couple of weeks off from parish ministry while we have summer help. Fr. Joseph has been a blessing in assisting me and Fr. Felix. His assistance has made it possible for us to take some time off during the month of August. Thank you for allowing me to be apart of your lives here at St. John the Evangelist. It is so wonderful and humbling to be your pastor in this beautiful area of Long Island. I am so grateful to Bishop Barres for assigning me here last year. It has been a wonderful experience getting to know so many of you. **Thank you again for all that you do in service to our church and community.** Thank you again for all of your loving support and generosity.

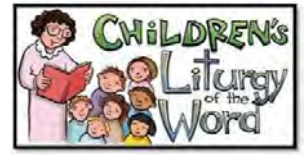

CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF THE WORD

Last Sunday, we reenacted the apostles' fearful journey in the boat, Peter stepping out in faith and then needing to be rescued. A special thanks to our actors! The children were captivated and entered into heartfelt discussion about storms, where they can find their own personal "mountaintop" to take some alone time with God, and needing to keep their eyes on Jesus!. They clearly understand that trusting in Jesus during every "storm" is the only way to keep from drowning. We can learn so much from them. Take a peek.!



There were two apostles in the boat, being tossed around by the storm. There was thunder and lightning and they were scared to death!

All of a sudden they looked up and saw someone coming toward them...someone walking on the water. Was it a ghost? They were so frightened, until Jesus let them know that it was Him and they shouldn't be afraid!



Trusting that it was Jesus, Peter stepped out of the boat and he too began to walk on the water. But then he took his eyes off Jesus, focused on the raging sea and the high winds and he began to sink. He called to Jesus to save him and of course, Jesus stretched out His hand and pulled Peter out of the water.



The message is pretty simple. Keep our focus on Christ, call out to Him in every situation, hold tightly to His outstretched hand and allow Him to rescue us! (Often easier said than done!). Let's pray for each other... that we can keep our eyes on Jesus and allow Him to be our Savior.

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

The abundance of God's love for us is what stood out for me in our readings today. If we consider the concept of abundance outside the Scriptures, it can be tricky. When we have it, does it imply we have too much when others have too little? If we are speaking of material things, then perhaps. But God's infinite and merciful love for us resound in each of our readings today, and this is cause for joy. In Isaiah, the Lord announces that he will accept offerings from anyone who holds to his covenant, Jewish or not. Saint Paul stresses that God's mercy is for *all*, and Jesus, after some back-and-forth with the Canaanite woman, heals the woman's daughter because of her great faith. God never tires of desiring healing and wholeness for *all* his children, which is a great gift. Let this gift of grace from God be a catalyst for us to reach out in love to others so that we also can come to God's "holy mountain and [be made] joyful in [his] house of prayer."

PRAY *Lord, Jesus Christ, give me the wisdom to view my hands as extensions of yours. Give me eyes to see all people as you see them. Help me to use my voice to praise you and bring the truth of your goodness to everyone I encounter. Give me the strength to have unwavering faith. Amen.*

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

How can we reach out in love to others as we called to do? Perhaps we can start with our parish. Is there a ministry we have read about in the bulletin that needs volunteers? Or a coordinator? Perhaps it is time to ask God how we can be his instrument in the world. We can start small. I will never forget when my friend volunteered to run our Vacation Bible School one summer. Of course, she turned to her friends to help her with this daunting task! What she desperately needed was someone to go from classroom to classroom and lead the children in song. Talk about out of my comfort zone! But she gave me the music books and song suggestions, and pretty soon, "This Little Light of Mine" was reverberating through the halls of the school. I learned then and there that kids don't notice the quality of your voice if you are joyful and enthusiastic. They love to sing! Take a chance and get out there. You won't regret it.
