

# A Message from Deacon Michael Hoonhout...

### 21st Sunday in Ordinary Time

With this Sunday, we conclude a five week hearing of the Bread of Life discourse from the sixth chapter of John's Gospel. After feeding a great multitude with a few loaves and fish, Jesus has taught that he is the true bread from heaven, given by the Father to give life to the world. To the shock and dismay of many of his listeners, he insists that the bread that he will give is his very flesh. Three times he says that his followers must eat his flesh and drink his blood in order to have eternal life. On hearing this, many of his own disciples say, "This saying is hard, who can accept it?"

Jesus is aware that they are troubled by what he has taught. His response seems strange as it does not seem to address their anxiety. Yet because it does address their misunderstanding it is worth pondering. Here is what Jesus says:

**"Does this shock you?** What if you were to see the Son of man ascending to where he was before? It is the spirit that gives life, while the flesh is of no avail. The words I have spoken to you are spirit and life."

Notice that Jesus begins by referring to his Ascension. Why? Because his listeners mistakenly think that the flesh Jesus will give as the true bread from heaven is his body in its current state, before he would offer it to the Father on the cross. Jesus truly does give us his flesh and blood as our food and drink, but it is the flesh and blood of his resurrected body after he suffered his Passion, died, rose from the dead, and ascended into heaven. His body has been wonderfully transformed by his Resurrection, for now it is "imperishable," "glorious," "powerful," and "spiritual" (1 Cor 15:42-44). After his Resurrection, Jesus is a "life-giving spirit" (1 Cor 15:45) who still has "flesh and bones" (Luke 24:39). Because his body is now spiritual, he can give his flesh to us as our food without suffering loss. For this is a crucial difference between material things and spiritual realities: when you give something material away, you no longer have what you give; but when you give something spiritual away, you retain what you give, and both the giver and the recipient now possess the same spiritual reality. For example, knowledge is something spiritual, and when a professor teaches a student what she knows the student learns the truth the professor still knows. The miracle of feeding of the multitudes demonstrated this spiritual principle, for as the apostles were distributing the loaves, the baskets did not empty.

When Jesus goes on to say that it is "the spirit that gives life, while the flesh is of no avail," he is not taking away his teaching that "unless you eat the flesh of the Son of man...you do not have life within you." Rather, he is clarifying that it is only when his body has been raised, transformed, and

made spiritual can his flesh give eternal life, for it has become spiritual and imperishable. When we receive the Eucharist, we eat the flesh of the One who has conquered death!

So what on the surface appears as a "hard saying" is actually a blessed teaching, words that give "spirit and life" to those who accept, believe, and obey Jesus' command to eat his flesh and drink his blood. Nonetheless, many of his disciples choose to leave Jesus. Jesus allows them to leave rather than change his teaching. That they were scandalized enough to leave Jesus is confirmation that Jesus was not speaking symbolically. Those who do not leave him are the apostles gathered with Peter and his confession, "You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and are convinced that you are the Holy One of God." What was true at the beginning of Christianity remains true today: many Christians who sincerely believe in Christ do not accept his teaching that He is the true bread from heaven who truly gives his flesh and blood for us to consume so that we might have eternal life. Those Christians who do accept this teaching are those who remain with the successor of St. Peter, confessing with the pope and all the bishops the teaching of the Catholic Church on the Eucharist. As Catholics we should be grateful for the authority Christ gave his apostles and their successors, for their authoritative teaching allows us to remain united in the fullness of the one faith that Jesus revealed to us, without discarding the hard sayings of Jesus.

Since Jesus desires to give his Body and Blood to all those who believe in Him, let us be worthy ambassadors of the Eucharist who promote faith in the Real Presence to our non-Catholic Christian brothers and sisters. To do this well requires that we are able to explain the Catholic teaching on the Eucharist, showing how it is supported in Scripture, especially in this Bread of Life discourse in the sixth chapter of the Gospel of John. But it also requires that we be transformed by the Eucharist, for it is the sacrament of charity. The Eucharist is Christ's risen Body, which he offered to the Father on the cross out of love for us. Every time we receive the Eucharist let us be renewed by the unbounded love of Jesus who laid down his life for his friends. May his selfsacrificing love for you overflow in your heart, so that you desire and pray that all his disciples come to recognize Jesus in the breaking of the bread.






# Moms on the Journey

# A Message from Msgr. Walden...

With all the events, reports and opinions of what is going on in our world, we need a strong base and foundation to live with peace, hope, and purpose. These past four weeks of the Gospel passages at Sunday Mass, including today, have come from chapter six of St. John's Gospel. To take Jesus and His words to heart is what we are all about as Catholic people of faith in the twenty-first century. Reflecting on Jesus' words these past Sundays, we think about what Jesus means for us as He says "I am the Bread of Life." As these words were first spoken 2000 years ago many people found them too hard to understand and accept. We have the advantage of over 2000 years of believers trusting and living with Jesus as the Bread of Life. As we continue our journey of faith, we are blessed and sustained by Jesus in the life giving Sacrament of the Eucharist. When Jesus asked His apostles in today's Gospel, "Do you also want to leave?" St. Peter answered: "Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and are convinced that you are the Holy One of God."

Who do we believe and trust with all our heart, soul, mind, and strength? Who do we want to invite and bring into the very depths of who we are, what we think, what we say, and what we do? Who or what inspires, triggers, and gives us purpose, hope, inspiration, and security? Financial security is very important to us. But even more, we need to be secure in how, why, and the way we think, act, and speak throughout each day, wherever we are, and whoever we are with, and even, as importantly, when we are alone. At times our minds wander and our thoughts inspire, challenge, and disturb us. Would that we would have the faith of St. Peter as He said: "You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and are convinced that you are the Holy One of God."

The word of Jesus were backed up by His actions and fueled by His love for the Father and us. He gives us Himself and invites us into His life with the Father, His Mother Mary, and one another. Each one of us is unique and loved for who we are. Is He that much a part of us as He invites us to be with Him? At times it is fearful to think I want to go to heaven and be loved



by God and everyone else when I have sinned, selfish, held grudges and been been judgmental. To trust in Jesus and His words is to humbly accept His mercy and be transformed. I am not just keeping Jesus happy, but allowing myself to be embraced by His love and presence in my life and my presence in His life. The key is to rise above all that blinds me to and keeps me from God's presence and love in my life. My ultimate security will only come when I place my trust, hopes, and love in Jesus' hands and heart.

I offer Psalm 23 for your personal reflection.

The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want. Fresh and green are the pastures where he gives me repose. Near restful waters he leads me, to revive my drooping spirit.

He guides me along the right path; he is true to his name. If I should walk in the valley of darkness no evil would I fear. You are there with your crook and your staff;

with these you give me comfort.

You have prepared a banquet for me in the sight of my foes. My head you have anointed with oil;

my cup is overflowing.

Surely goodness and kindness shall follow me all the days of my life. In the Lord's own house shall I dwell for ever and ever. Glory...

### Psalm Prayer:

Lord Jesus Christ, Shepherd of your Church, you give us new birth in the waters of Baptism; you anoint us with oil, and call us to salvation at your table. Dispel the terrors of death and the darkness of error. Lead your people along safe paths, that they may rest securely in you and live for ever in your Father's house.


