FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Doers of the Word

DON'T DELUDE YOURSELF!

Dear Parish Family:

We will begin praying with the Letter of St. James this week at Sunday Masses. It's a short letter in the Bible but it does not mince words about how to live this Christian life. As we listen to the words of James, we will hear the development of the mission he calls for today, "Be doers of the word and not hearers only, deluding yourselves" (James 1:22). In a particular way James emphasizes the need for us to be engaged with the marginalized—the poor, the sick, the widow, the orphan. Be ready for "What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if someone says he has faith but does not have works?", "faith of itself, if it does not have works, is dead", "You ask but do not receive, because you ask wrongly, to spend it on your passions" and so on. Any delusions about caring for the poor as a response to our faith should be addressed in the weeks ahead by the Word of God. Stay tuned!

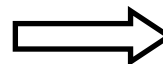


Working from this letter, I want to share some exciting news about Parish Social Ministry at St. John the Evangelist. Katie Spellman will be the new Coordinator of Parish Social Ministry at SJE. I am really happy that Katie is going to join the Pastoral Team to coordinate this vital aspect of our parish's mission. Katie brings a wealth of administrative and human resource experience that I know will help Parish Social Ministry to continue to respond to those in need. In addition, Katie has been involved with a number of our parish social ministries and has a sense of some of the many great things that happen in our parish.

As we welcome Katie, we welcome her to a new position. Katie is not replacing Alex Finta or Sister Ann or anyone else and her role will be different. Katie will work to provide support and direction for each of the parish social ministries as well as identify needs in the local community and how our parish may be best able to serve them. As this is a new position, undoubtedly, we'll do some learning together about the various aspects of this role and how it will transform in the times ahead. So let's be patient in these days too! Christian Diconsiglio, our PSM Case Manager, will work with Katie and focus on many of the case work/client intake issues that come to our social ministry offices. I am excited to see all that God has in store for parish social ministry at SJE!

A second and very important thought relates to a great spirit of gratitude—always gratitude. Our parish social ministry leaders have been so good and so patient in adjusting in this 'in-between time' and worked in a such a way that our parish social ministries have not missed a beat. They have worked together, developed new ways to collaborate, served those in need in the midst of a pandemic, and so much more. Our parish is blessed, indeed.

An enormous debt of gratitude is extended to Christian Diconsiglio. Since the start of the pandemic, Christian has stepped up in ways above and beyond anything he signed up for when he first joined the staff. In the midst of the most challenging times related to COVID-19, Christian helped to keep the pantry and street ministry going in addition to helping individuals and families in need. Since we have been without someone in the coordinator/director role, Christian has taken on the bulk of the parish social ministry coordination and helped our parish in more ways than you can know. Christian remains a vital part of the parish staff here and will now work with Katie in many areas of parish social ministry. We are excited for Christian too! He will begin attending Molloy College in the next few weeks as he embarks on studies that will lead to a Master's Degree in Social Work while maintaining his position here.

This news and the Word is a call to each one of us! We, too, must be “doers of the Word”. First, this requires that we know the Word. I do not necessarily mean the entirety of Scripture. Rather, I mean the “Word made flesh”, Jesus Christ. If we are working at that relationship with Him a love response to one another can never be far behind. As disciples, it cannot be separate from that relationship either. We are not simple do-gooders or nice people or social workers or community organizers. Yes, those things may be part of our work. Agreed. However, they can and should come from that relationship with Christ and His Church.

Whatever it is, do something! You can be homebound and be a doer of the Word. You can be young, old, married, single, new to the Church or a “veteran” of sorts! Don’t delude yourself into thinking this call does not apply to each one of us—you and me included!

So let’s pray for Katie and all who serve and minister in Parish Social Ministry! In response to the Word, I think we’re going to continue to do great things for the Lord and His people.

If you can, please say a prayer for me.

REMEMBERING 9/11

This year, we mark the 20th Anniversary of the terrorist attacks on the United States of American that took place on September 11, 2011. Each and every one of us, whether we realize it or not, has been impacted in some way this day. This day changed the way we live. Fear and anxiety more radically plague our lives and our hearts. A certain innocence was lost that day.



As a parish and local community, we want to take some time to remember this. Recognizing that we are each in a different place, we want to offer a number of ways for us to remember in prayer:

9/11 Remembrance Space

Our Art and Environment Ministry will create a space in Our Lady's Chapel to place reminders and symbols of 9/11/01. This may be different for each of us. You might have a picture of a loved one or a memento of the time or a religious symbol that might offer you (and therefore hopefully others) some consolation

Items can be left from September 1, 2021 through September 11, 2021. We respectfully ask that all items be picked up by September 12, 2021.

Candlelight Prayer Service

We will gather at 6:30 p.m. on the Convent Lawn for a Candlelight Service of Remembrance on September 11, 2021 for all those whose lives were lost or impacted by loss on September 11, 2011. We extend a special greeting of welcome to all first responders to come and pray with us.

The Evening Prayer will allow us to enlighten the darkness of this day with the light of God's grace and love. Please make every effort to come. Please bring your own chair (though we do have some chairs available).

Day of Prayer

The Church and Seton Chapel will remain open throughout the day for times of quiet prayer and adoration (Please note: Exposition will not take place). The Church will remain free with the exception of baptisms at 12 Noon and Seton Chapel will remain open all day.

We will also mark significant times of this day with our parish church bells.

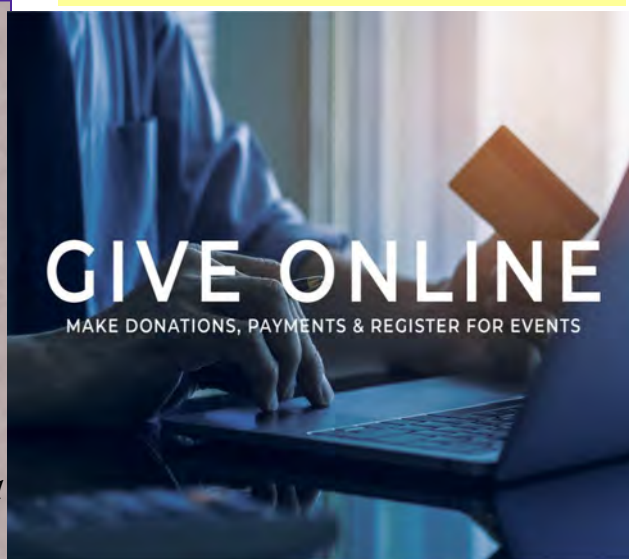
