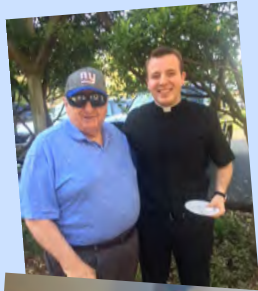

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

St. John Vianney, pray for us!

PARISH SOCIAL MINISTRY

Dear Parish Family:

Today's date—August 4th is traditionally the Feast of St. John Vianney. (Because it's a Sunday, the 18th Sunday in Ordinary Time has liturgical precedence.) St. John Vianney is the patron saint of parish priests. Like many of the saints, he has a great story. He struggled in his studies. He endured. He worked through it. He was an unlikely candidate for priesthood. Eventually, he completed his studies and was ordained a priest. A great transformation occurred.

As a priest, St. John Vianney was eventually assigned to Ars. It had become a town devoid of faith and religious practice. By working to live a devout life, in the midst of his own temptations and weaknesses, St. John Vianney's example helped to transform this unlikely village from a place of emptiness to a place of great faith. A great transformation occurred.

This week, as a parish, we are invited to consider the work of Parish Social Ministry and how each one of us must become more engaged. It is not a question of "if", but "how". Each week at Mass we are told to "Go forth" or to "Go and announce the Gospel of the Lord" or "Go in peace, glorifying the Lord by your life" (*Roman Missal* 144). Parish Social Ministry is one clear way each one of us can do this and, in this parish, there are many, many ways we can carry this out. (You can read pages 10-12 in this week's bulletin to learn more.) Through the varied ministries, we seek to bring about God's work so great transformations can happen here.

Our focus this weekend is on enhancing two of our newest ministries—the Street Ministry and the Community Meal Ministry.

The Street Ministry began in January 2017 and has grown into a "small army" of volunteers. Volunteers come on Thursday night and now serve and minister to nearly 75-80 men, women and children (yes, children!). Did you also know that many individuals and parishioners make small trays of food for each Thursday? Volunteers are needed to sort clothes during the day and prepare materials for each week's run. Sometimes parishioners who do not feel comfortable going out on a run do this and other times some great cooks come forward. As this ministry grows and some of the "original" volunteers take a break, more hearts and hands are needed for some great transformations to continue.

The Community Meal Ministry began in March of 2017 on Sunday afternoons. The ministry went on hiatus as we had to use the Auditorium for Mass.

Now held once a month, volunteers serve on average 35-40 guests each meal. We are looking to expand the Community Meal ministry so that we can offer meals two times a month. But that needs someone like you—to serve, to prepare a meal, to welcome guests and more. Wouldn't it be great if we can expand the Community Meal to every week down the road? Again, with more hands and hearts—maybe yours?! - more opportunities for great transformations will exist.

You know this is not all that happens in the area of Parish Social Ministry. Great transformations are occurring weekly in Ernie's Place, St. John's Food Pantry Ministry. The Thrift Shop allows those in need to obtain great bargains for many necessities. The Lower Meeting Room of the Red Barn is home to a great recovery network. Sister Ann is seeking to help transform the lives of many of our seniors. We are looking to begin an effort at a medical consultation ministry soon. The Society of St. Vincent de Paul is



helping those in need through home visits and furniture provisions. The Giving Garden is bearing tremendous fruit (and vegetables) and the Chicken Ministry is about to hatch allowing for healthier food and perhaps another stream of income for Parish Social Ministry. (I'm not eggs-actly sure how it will work out yet.)

Ultimately, all of these works are in place to provide for people's basic needs while also trying to address deeper, underlying issues. To give someone a bag of food at Ernie's Place or some clothes at the Street Ministry is only the first step. The goal is to build a close relationship so even deeper and more long lasting transformations can happen. That's where the outreach office volunteers under the direction of Alex Finta and his staff seek to help guests and clients move to the next level of transformation and growth. This takes time, a lot of time. Their work is tremendous. Quiet, often unseen and very little attention given, they plant some seeds that we pray will make long lasting transformations.

Being a parish priest is awesome, especially here at St. John the Evangelist. In preparing for today, I have had some time to reflect on all that this vocation has given me. What transformations God has allowed to happen in me. I am always humbled by the outpouring of love and support extended to me by each of you. It's an outpouring that goes far beyond me. I am just one who has received as are the thousands served through your generosity and support of Parish Social Ministry.

This weekend, I am honored to welcome Bishop Murphy who ordained me as a priest on December 3, 2011 and Msgr. Jim Vlaun who vested me as a priest on that same day. They are helping to cover a few Masses while Fr. Michael is away. On this feast day of St. John Vianney, they are two priests who have helped God transform me through their ministry and witness. These have been years of great and surprising transformations I assure you!

May we who are poor and vulnerable, like St. John Vianney, seek to be transformed so we may be instruments of transformation for those we are called to serve, particularly through Parish Social Ministry.

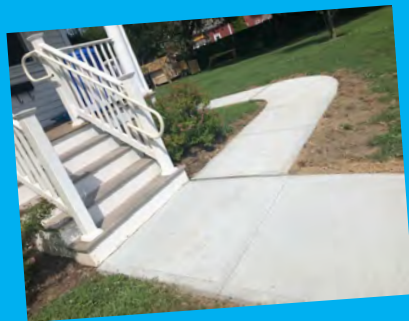

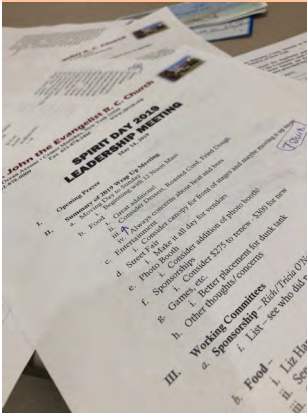

The Divine Office

As you can tell from the bulletin – and perhaps as you participated in the life of our parish – we pray the Divine Office, the Liturgy of the Hours, throughout the week. It is our hope that this prayer of the Church will take even greater hold in our parish.



For the next few weeks, we'll share excerpts of

Catholic 101: Intro to the "Liturgy of the Hours" by Jason Downer, SJ. The article was taken from The Jesuit Post.

August 4th

"Never Heard of It."

That makes a lot of sense! Most Catholics may be vaguely aware that it exists, but have never had the opportunity to pray with it. Very briefly, the Liturgy of the Hours is based in the psalms. There are five "hours" during the day: Morning, Daytime, Evening, Night, and Office of Readings. They do not actually take an hour to pray, each one can be about 15-20 minutes.

Night prayer is my favorite one, although it can be a little dark at times. For example, Friday night prayer is from Psalm 88 featuring the line, "Darkness is my only companion." But the sun has set by the time I'm praying it, so there's something fitting about those words.

The Liturgy of the Hours also consists of a four-week cycle, and it has different prayers available for certain feast days. Timothy Gallagher puts it very nicely saying, "It is first and above all a prayer of praise; then, immediately after that, a prayer of intercession for the salvation of the whole world, for the needs of all the members of the Church and all the people in the world."

Anyone can pray this. If it sounds a little complicated, that's okay. There is a great app, iBreviary, which offers a user-friendly approach to praying it. Basically, you pick the hour of the day you want to pray, and just scroll your way through the psalms, antiphons, and prayers in order. No ribbons!
