#### Happy Feast of the Transfiguration!

Today's readings bring us face to face with the glory of God. Are we ready? Do we allow ourselves to enter into the awe of that mountaintop experience? Truth be told...I sometimes worry about "us" when it comes to things like this. Are we so overexposed to the many high-tech things of this world that nothing "wows" us anymore...even the Transfiguration? Are we too reserved to fall on our knees and praise our God? Do these familiar scriptures become just that...all too familiar? Perhaps a minute to revisit the wonder and awe of children might help.

Two weeks ago we had our Vacation Bible Camp. Our theme was "Stellar...Shining Jesus' Light." To that end we created an outer space environment in the auditorium. Use your imaginations and picture this.... With a 60ft. x 30ft. black tarp suspended from the ceiling on a cable and a variety of pink and blue fairy lights taped to the inside of the tarp, the children entered through a silver balloon arch, and were transported into the "universe". It was pretty dark under the tarp, but the fairy lights, carefully strung to look like constellations, provided just enough light to make everything curiously inviting. The stage was transformed into the surface of the moon complete with craters, a lunar rover, a rocket ship, aliens and a huge astronaut who was taking a monumentous step onto the moon. Planets and stars were suspended from the stage ceiling and the neon green floodlights provided the finishing touch. As the children entered the auditotium their jaws dropped. With eyes opened wide they feverishly scanned the "universe". Their precious little eyes darted back and forth and up and down from the star-laden "night sky" to the lunar extravaganza on the stage. Immediately we could hear the buzz of excited comments like, "Look over there!" "There's a rocket!" "This is so cool!" reassuring our dedicated VBC crew that our hard work had truly launched our little campers out of this world. With smiles as wide as their eyes, the wonder of Vacation Bible Camp had begun It was awesome!

Children are just amazing! They allow themselves to truly enter into the situation. They embrace their environment and allow themselves to be awestruck. They are all in. They are beacons of hope and genuine examples for us to follow. It's no wonder that Jesus said, "Truly I tell you, unless you change and become like children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven." (Matthew 18:3).

So on this Feast of the Transfiguration perhaps the challenge for all of us is to become like the children at VBC and enter into that majesty of our Great and Glorious God. Please bear with this invitation to become part of the scripture. Take some quiet time this week to revisit today's readings. They are filled with brilliant descriptions, that when read deliberately can plunge us right into the scripture.

Close your eyes and imagine what Daniel describes as The Ancient One sits on the throne. Do you see the dazzling white clothing and the burning flames? Allow yourself to go there and stand in awe. Become one of the thousands who were ministering to Him. Shake in your boots a little as the books are opened and the judgment begins. Watch as the Son of Man receives His kinship and dominion. Unbelieva-

ble! But it doesn't end there. Peter's letter reminds us that there were eyewitnesses who saw the transfigured Christ and heard the voice from heaven. Let's go there. It is humbling...but much needed.



Climb the mountain with James and John and Peter. Do you feel the air thinning? Perhaps it's a little harder to breathe. Finally, you are at the top, you bend down to catch your breath and when you lift your eyes you see Jesus totally transformed. His clothes are dazzling white- almost blinding. His face is shining like nothing you have ever seen before. And then Moses and Elijah are there. You rub your eyes to make sure you aren't dreaming. And then you hear the voice from heaven. It is loud....booming, but gentle; confirming that Jesus is the Son of God. And there is no question of what we are to do...nothing to figure out. The message is clear, "Listen to Him." Allow yourself to be awestruck...even frightened. Picture yourself, head down, eyes closed, cowering in fear; yet somehow curiously amazed and wanting to look up again. Hear Jesus' compassionate voice. Feel His reassuring hand on your shoulder. "Rise and do not be afraid." Rest in that message for a few minutes. What a gift!

This is such a powerful gospel. In many ways it captures our mission as followers of Christ.

We need to remember that God is God...DIVINE...the Most High ...all powerful...all loving...all forgiving...eternal. We need to fall on our knees. Praise Him. Marvel at His goodness and glory.

Listen to Jesus, the Son of God. It's not just a suggestion... it's a loving directive accompanied by free will.

Do not be afraid...allow Jesus to reassure us, guide us, carry us and to raise us up.

We too, are the beloved sons and daughters of God, called by name to be with Him, for all eternity.

Today, let's pray that we have the willingness, courage and humility to surrender and answer that heavenly call with joyful anticipation of the awesome, blessings that await! With hope for the grace to enter in,

# Feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord

Dn 7:9-10, 13-14 | 2 Pt 1:16-19 | Mt 17:1-9

#### GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

According to the dictionary definition, to be transfigured is to "transform into something more beautiful or elevated." This is what we see happening in Matthew's Gospel today: Jesus takes his closest disciples up the mountain and there he is transformed - he is *transfigured* - before them: "His face shone like the sun and his clothes became white as light." He is also joined by Moses and Elijah as a sign that he is the fulfillment of God's promises of old. Jesus completes the old covenant that God made with his people and brings us the new covenant of salvation. The Transfiguration parallels the Baptism of the Lord in that we once again hear God speaking from the heavens to say, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased." But during the Transfiguration, God adds the words, "Listen to him." That's a command not just for his disciples there on the mountain but for us today as well.

#### GO EVANGELIZE

#### PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

In elementary school, we were often reminded to listen. I remember one teacher who made a point to impress upon our class that listening is different from hearing. It is easy to hear, but to listen, you need to take the time to understand what is being said. In his letter today, Peter is urging us to listen to the prophetic message of Jesus. He says, "You will do well to be attentive to it" and then compares doing so to being "a lamp shining in a dark place." The world today can be a very dark place, but we don't have to be content to live in the shadows. By following Jesus' example and commands, we can bring light – along with hope and joy – to our corner of the world. Sometimes that takes courage, though. It might involve making uncomfortable or unpopular choices, but Peter promises that the "day will dawn." When that happens, we will undoubtedly see the fruits of our good works in our efforts to build God's kingdom.

**PRAY** This week, let us pray in both words and actions as Jesus taught us. If the Lord's Prayer is not already part of your daily prayer routine, try incorporating it this week. Then, look for ways to follow in the footsteps of Jesus by reaching out to someone who may appreciate a phone call or a visit.

#### GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

Unlike with our other important relationships, God isn't exactly someone we can meet for coffee and look into his eyes while having a conversation. Whether we talk to God in our mind or out loud, we recognize that even with a good prayer life it can sometimes be difficult to cultivate and maintain a relationship with God. Doubters and unbelievers are quick to remind us how impossible it is to believe what we cannot see or hear, but today's readings also remind us that God doesn't speak to us as another human being would. Maybe he doesn't speak with the booming voice of a preacher or a politician, and maybe he doesn't write direct messages for us in the sky or sand, but God does speak. Perhaps, like Elijah, we tend to expect God to communicate with huge gestures, such as strong wind that crushes rocks, or earthquakes or fires; but we hear today that God spoke to Elijah in a "tiny whispering sound." It's not unlike a very good teacher who doesn't need to raise her voice to get her students' attention when they lose focus - she has their respect and simply needs to speak normally and calmiy and the students quiet down, pay attention, and listen. When we still our hearts and minds and listen, in prayer, let us be confident we will hear God's voice.

#### GO EVANGELIZE

#### PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Perhaps in order to hear God's voice in our lives we need to fine-tune our "hearing." First, how can we hear if we do not have faith? Jesus called Peter out of the boat and into stormy waters, and though he was able to walk on water for a time, Peter began to sink because he became afraid. Doubt or fear can hamper our ability to listen to the Lord clearly; don't let it cloud your love for Christ! Second, we must keep in mind the many ways God speaks to us: his Word (the Bible), the writings of the saints and Church Fathers, our Catholic Tradition, other people God has placed in our lives, and the "tiny whispering sound" we might hear only within our heart. Stay attuned to God's voice; the rewards are heavenly.

**INVITATION** Ignatian spirituality - meditations, prayers, and contemplative practices - may help us recognize and truly hear the still small voice of God in our lives. The Daily Examen is a prayerful reflection on the events of the day which might help us identify the movement of the Holy Spirit in those moments. Give it a try.
