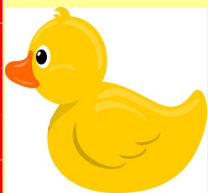

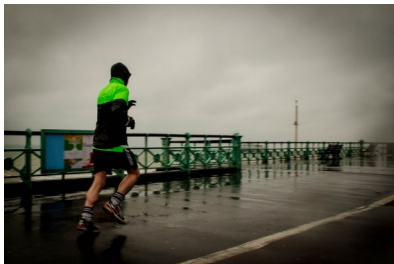

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Elijah, Exhaustion, and the Eucharist



ON THE RUN AND DONE

Dear Parish Family:

I've lost touch a bit with family friends I was pretty close to for a while. There's nothing wrong, that is to say, no fight or disagreements. I caught up with one of the members of the family a few weeks ago while we are at the same store and he said, "FJ, we don't even see each other these days. It's not you. We're just all over the place. Don't give up." I can't say it made me feel any less bad and I can't say there aren't times I feel like giving up. While their lives are on the run, I

can feel sort of done with it all.

This image came to me when I think about Elijah in today's First Reading. If you have some time this week read the stories around today's passage. Pray with Chapters 18 and 19 of the second book of Kings. I think you might see what I mean.

So many of us are on the run in one way or another. It may be like Elijah when there is a need to avoid things of the past or move away from them. Others of us are in constant motion constantly needing to be doing something. For others, we just are too afraid to be still and alone with ourselves, not to mention God.

Elijah finds himself in this situation. He is on the run after having destroyed (not pretty) the followers of Baal and living with some deep regret over this. We find him in today's reading sort of done saying, "Enough, LORD! Take my life, for I am no better than my ancestors." Enough. No more. I cannot take any more. I am done.

Does the Lord allow him to be finished? No. Of course not. What does he do? He provides him with food and nourishment. This is good. Very good. For this not only nourishes his body, it opens his Spirit. He is actually able to see God in some surprising ways. Not in the big signs but in very simple ways. You read the rest on your own (2 Kings 19:9 and following). Go ahead...get that Bible!

You may feel some more of the "done" feeling these days. I know I do. I'm tired of hearing about scandal and division in the Church. The challenges of a changing church in the midst of bankruptcy and failure can take me out at times. I'm frustrated by people battling unnecessary sickness. I'm disheartened by the disunity that is perpetuated by some who call themselves Catholic, some who I call friend. I'm aggravated that again we may need to make more changes to our way of life because of stubbornness and ideology and we are not even going into the internal Fr. John :)...not enough pages for that!

When I find myself like this I try to always look back. Not to say, "we've been here before" but at various times and moments we have been up against similar (not the same) challenges and difficulties. At those various times and moments, God comes through. Perhaps not in the big ways I want but in the simple, quiet ways he did with Elijah.

I see the incredible work of the Church in spite of its failures and sins. I see the real treasure of the Church (YOU!) in the midst of financial and organizational difficulties. I see the healing work of nurses and doctors quietly doing what needs to be done, again, either by caring for the sick or providing vaccinations and necessary community resources. I see the quiet conversation that takes places after one of our Masses between two people who see the world very differently. I quietly accept that I may need to sacrifice comfort and convenience for the sake of others and I know I'll be humbled that so many others will do it more gracefully than I.

What is the key? I think Elijah teaches us about the need to be honest with the Lord and then quiet enough to see him at work. Good lessons for the spiritual life indeed. Tell the Lord from your heart how you are feeling. To be honest, I've talked to him about some of the pain of the first paragraph. Then, be brave enough to be quiet, to be. Find a place—the beach, your favorite chair, the church building, Seton Chapel, a walk, - and just be. You may not see the world turn around but the simple signs that God is here.

Come to think of it...I don't go to 7-11 that often. I normally would not have been there except our coffee maker broke. After cleaning up the counter, the floor, the coffee maker and perhaps uttering some un-prophet like phrases, I headed out. I should not have seen that family member. It was his first day off of work all summer he told me. Probably the sign I needed not to be done....to "get up" as the angel tells Elijah and remember the Lord has me exactly where he needs me. The same is true for you. No need to run and no need to be done. If you can, please say a prayer for me.

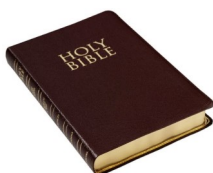
Grandparents' Ministry/Support Group

Scripture Study

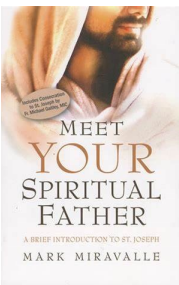

Discussion Questions

1. Sometimes we are Elijah and sometimes we are the hearth cake. Think of times in your life when you wanted to cry, “enough” and you could have used some help from somewhere. Did help come? How?
2. Do you think you could get better at “being an imitator of God?” How? Is it more likely to happen all at once because you want it to, or a little at a time because you work at letting God into you? If you were going to try for this, where would you start?
3. The crowd murmured when Jesus said he was the bread that came down from heaven. They knew his mother and father: how did this impact their willingness to believe him? Is it easy to accept a “prophet” [one who speaks for God] in your own circle of acquaintances? Explain.

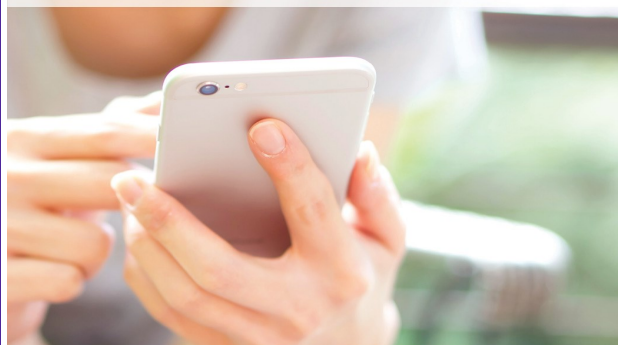
