A Message from Deacon Mike...

Think a moment about the last time someone said something to you that was unkind and heartless. Rather than simply recalling a past incident that was hurtful, go one step further in your reflection and ask yourself: how many *other* people did I tell about what that person said before I brought it up with the person who actually said it? If you are like me, telling others about what someone said or did to me and fishing for sympathy is a whole lot easier than actually bringing it up with the perpetrator and telling him what he said was wrong. Perhaps it is a way to get back at the person—you hurt me, so now let me tell others how awful you can be. With the person himself I would rather pretend it never happened than actually point out his fault.

When someone has hurt us it is so easy for us to focus on *our* emotional pain, and when we think of the person who has hurt us it is often just with anger. Jesus wants to be different than this. He wants us to think of the good of the person who has sinned against us and courageously point out his fault to him so that he can repent.

A few week ago we heard Jesus commanded us to forgive out brother 'seventy times seven times.' Here he asks for something more: *reconciliation*, the healing and restoration of the relationship. Reconciliation is a step further than forgiveness. It involves more than simply the writing off of a debt, giving up the desire for revenge or retribution, the willingness to move on. Reconciliation means making everything right again so that the two can be one again in Christ. And since our unity in Christ is not just in love but in truth, reconciliation requires a mutual honesty where both parties understand one another. Any relationship where the past is negatively affecting the present is an unreconciled relationship.

And so Jesus challenges us in this Gospel to speak honestly with the person who has sinned against us and point out the fault he or she has committed. He wants us to do this not out of anger or with a desire to shame, but so that the relationship can be restored and the sinner can come to an honest accounting of what he has done. This is an act of charity on the part of the victim to the perpetrator, a simple example of 'loving your enemy.' To do so takes courage, and there is no guarantee the person will be open to the correction. In fact, Jesus speaks of further steps to take if the one-on-one conversation fails. He is so insistent on a sustained effort toward reconciliation because the Church is not the Church without a genuine unity in truth and love among her members. As the end of the passage makes clear, Christ is really present among us sinners when we are truly joined in prayer and common purpose, and this is not the case when we pray together while holding various unspoken resentments against others among us.

Charity in truth. Truth in charity. Our unity requires both charity and truth, not one without the other. Did you know that the Eucharist is the sacrament of charity, the sacrament of unity? It is meant to make us one in Christ and loving toward one another. For us to be truly united by the Eucharist we must be living in love and truth before God and with one another. This is the year of the **National Eucharistic Revival**, and to bring it here we have some good things planned for our parish. Let this Gospel remind us that the Eucharist is not a private moment between you and God, but a communal act of unifying many forgiven sinners in Christ. May the Eucharist give you love for the sinner who has hurt you and the courage to work towards an honest reconciliation with him or her.

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

Years ago, I was asked to take in a hound dog and I was happy to do so, but it wasn't until I brought the dog home that I discovered how adamantly opposed my husband was to the idea. When asked, he had never said "no," but he thought I should just know he didn't want the dog. Obviously, we needed to work on our communication skills! Proper communication and what it means to love in relationship are what come to mind when I hear the start of today's Gospel. Jesus is instructing us on what to do when another angers, hurts, or offends us. Not surprisingly, it doesn't include calling our sister or best friend to vent, or posting about it on social media, regardless of how vaguely we word the situation. Instead we are to go to that person directly and "tell him his fault between you and him alone." If they listen, we have won them over. How many times have others hurt us but we never bother to tell them? How often do we simply assume the other person knows they have done us wrong? We owe it to one another to be honest and upfront - to give the other person a chance to apologize and us a chance to extend forgiveness. We also owe it to one another to be willing to receive them in charity, open-hearted, when they come to us to speak of our faults.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

In the same way that the Gospel addresses speaking truth to another and "winning them over," the prophet Ezekiel recounts the Lord's instruction to him that he has a duty to "speak out to dissuade the wicked from his way." This, of course, was the role and mission of the prophets. To make known the word and law of God and call the people to respond. A prophet warned, counseled, taught, and encouraged. They called the people to obedience to God, denouncing idolatry, injustice, and empty rituals. Jesus himself came as priest, prophet, and king and by our baptism, "the whole People of God participates in these three offices of Christ and bears the responsibilities for mission and service that flow from them." (CCC 783) Through the centuries, people have tried to do this in various ways - from passing laws to standing on street corners with signs. But let's remember that even as we are meant to "speak out," we are also meant to listen. We too must be re-converted to the truth when we sin; we too must be dissuaded from our wicked ways. This is how we best fulfill our prophetic mission.

PRAY Witnessing to Christ in today's world sometimes feels overwhelming or hopeless. Spend some concerted time in prayer with the words from today's psalm: "If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts."




