FEEDING THE HUNGRY

Dear Parish Family:

Long time—no writing! With letters from others (Louis, Fr. Jaime, Fr. Michael, etc.), I did not want to overwhelm you with words in August. I hope to return to sharing something weekly.

Last evening, I watched a PBS Frontline special, "Growing Up Poor in America". The documentary follows three families impacted by the pandemic in the state of Ohio. There were many issues and factors the documentary revealed. It was jarring and, unfortunately, not that much different than many of the situations found in our own area in these days and times. Add to this the moments and places of social unrest in our country, I was left with a sense of despair.

In addition to the practical realities of these situations (not enough food, dilapidated housing, lack of resources, physical illness), I could not help but sense a similar sense of despair in those profiled.



Again, unfortunately, this is not too different than the situations we find ourselves in our own area.

Over the past months, our Parish Social Ministry has sought to be present to the "practical" needs of our parish. There is always more to do and we are always trying to discern the best ways to do this. Alex Finta, Christian Diconsiglio and members of our staff have worked hard to keep the pantry running and provide direct service to clients in need. A very limited number of volunteers (sometimes only one because of distancing requirements) kept the Street Ministry going. Now, we are beginning to return to a new normal. The Thrift Shop opened this week with a new layout and adapting to different times. We hope to welcome back interested volunteers from Ernie's Place and welcome new ones too as we add additional hours. The Street Ministry and Community Meal are being restored. We're getting there.

You need to know that none of this would ever be possible without your support—your financial support, donations online, offerings in the PSM envelopes and the Poor Box allowed (and allow) all of these things to happen. Thank you! Thank you!

In talking with Alex, one reality is that the deepest needs may not be the practical or the material. Behind every request for support (housing assistance, food, clothing) is a deeper hunger for healing, a desire for healing that is deep beyond the physical and medical.



Beginning this week, we are going to begin the process of launching the Magdala Counseling Center as part of Parish Social Ministry at St. John the Evangelist. This will take us the next few months to build. It is our hope this center will allow our parishioners who are psychologists, counselors, social workers and mental health counselors to share their experience and expertise with individuals, families, and groups. We chose the name because Mary Magdalene is the first to see Jesus, to know his healing presence in the Gospel of John. There is a mysterious (even secretive part) of Mary Magdalene. Scripture only tells us that demons were cast out of her though we are unsure of the specific details. We know that she worked through some challenge to become a disciple and eventual-

ly the "apostles to the Apostles".

This is a good image for us as we launch this vital work of serving God's people. The truth is that so many of our struggles are hidden and when we allow the light to touch them they become less powerful and may even better allow us to heal others.

Like most things, this will take time to get up and running. Our first step will be getting volunteers to serve as counselors. (See the ad below.) Then we will begin the process of letting people know how they can seek support from the Magdala Counseling Center.

As you know, I am a social worker. I don't consider this a purely social work act. I am reminded of the words of St. Teresa of Calcutta when she prayed at the National Prayer Breakfast in 1994. In speaking of the work of the Missionaries of Charity, she stated, "We are not social workers. We may be doing social work in the



eyes of some people, but we must be contemplatives in the heart of the world. For we must bring that presence of God into your family." So much of our parish social ministry involves social work activity and ideas. It must if it going to effectively meet people's needs.

It cannot start from there or end there. If it is the work of the church it must come from a place of deep contemplation for the needs of God's people and our response to God's call in our own lives.

Let's continue to pray for the hungry—the hungry in body, mind, and spirit. Let's pray that our parish will continue to respond to the needs of those who come to our doors that we learn from them and so become more "poor in spirit", more reliant on our God.

If you can, please say a prayer for me.


Come to The Six!


As you may have noticed, our Sunday morning Masses are beginning to fill up. This is good news!






