# A Message from Deacon Ed Grieb...

As you may know, the Church in the United States has been in the midst of a National Eucharistic Revival the past couple years, a Revival meant to be a reminder of the goodness of God in our lives, the wonderful gift we've been given in the Eucharist and our call to go out to the world with Him alive in our hearts.

As part of the revival, I had the wonderful opportunity to experience the National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis a couple weeks ago, joining close to 60,000 faithful in Indianapolis in prayer, worship and fellowship. Congress, or gathering, was pretty straight forward -- we started each day with Mass, ended with Adoration, and in between had the opportunity to listen to inspirational speakers as we were stirred in grace and renewal in our faith. One of the most inspiring experiences for me was seeing the number of families there together, parents with 2, 3 and sometimes more young children making their way through the crowds and being joyful witnesses to God's creating Love.



Recently, I have experienced seeing that same joyful witness in the parishioners at St. John



the Evangelist parish. By way of introduction, my name is Deacon Ed (Grieb). You may have heard from Fr. Patrick or others that I am recently assigned to serve here at St. John the Evangelist beginning August 30th. I was ordained a little over seven years ago and have served at St. Joseph parish in Ronkonkoma. My wife, Sue and I have three grown children, and we moved to Eastport five years ago from Lake Grove. We were parishioners at St. Joseph for 20 years or so and our children went to school at the parish elementary school (the two boys later graduated from St. John the Baptist High School and our daughter from Our Lady of Mercy Academy). We are very excited about transferring to the parish as we have enjoyed attending Mass other when and events here the opportunity arose (and we didn't have to drive 25 miles back to St Joseph). I may look familiar to some of you, as I also attend daily Mass (7 AM), where I met Fr. Patrick a couple of years back and the idea of transferring started to take hold.

We leave St. Joseph with fond memories but are looking forward to a new renewal here with the wonderful parishioners of St. John.

# A Message from Msgr. Walden...

"This great nation is truly a wise and intelligent people.' For what great nation is there that has gods so close to it as the LORD, our God, is to us whenever we call upon him? Or what great nation has statutes and decrees that are as just as this whole law which I am setting before you today?" These are the concluding words of the first reading at Mass today from the Book of Deuteronomy. They offer the Jewish people great hope and true guidance as they are on the cusp of entering the Promised Land. It is not the physical place that makes the Promised Land but the attitude and morality of the people who live there. The Jewish people trace their roots back to the Ten Commandments given to Moses for them.

Where is the Promised Land? That is not so much a place but a group of people who are truly just, loving and humble. Growing up in the late 1940s and 1950s in America was a time I look back on and see great examples of the USA being a Promised Land. There was justice, respect for one another, and a bond that we had. There were the two political parties and they worked together for our good. We were known as the land of the free and the home of the brave. Where are we That thought came to mind a week ago Saturday as I was praying the rosary with two other people on Waverly Avenue in Patchogue near the Planned Parenthood facility. One had a sign that offered help with healing from an abortion and another had a large heart with the image of a child in the womb in it. All of a sudden a car stopped next to us and asked what were doing there. One of the people went down to speak with her. She was angry and said we had no right to be there. (So much for the land of the free and the home of the brave!) She was very pro-abortion and said she had an abortion when she was seventeen years old. She was now an adult woman in an expensive car whose conscience we disturbed. She saw our "presence" as condemnatory. There were no harsh words from our mouths. I saw her as a woman trying to escape her conscience. Over many years women who had abortions have spoken to me and expressed great sorrow and sadness for what they did years ago. Nurturing, protecting and welcoming new life into our families and lives is who we are and what we are about as fellow human beings. Created in the image and likeness of God we can surmount any difficulty or unplanned surprise with determination, love, and truth.



How I shudder when I see the desire of the Democratic candidate for president of our country over and over again seeking to make the right to an abortion enshrined in our nation. We are still recovering from the scandal of abuse of children, a dark spot in our Church and nation. But we have no problem embracing and supporting those in our government and those seeking to be elected even as they make abortion front and center of their campaign. How sad we have gone from the Land of the Free and the Brave to a Land of the Depraved and Immoral in our leadership. How can we really trust people who openly defend and promote the murder of the most vulnerable and innocent in our midst. Hitler murdered twelve million people in gas chambers. We have far surpassed that number with legalized abortions.

Again, I am not telling anyone who to vote for. But by all means, look at the moral direction our candidates are seeking to go in. None of them are perfect, but please don't follow the wayward to the gates of hell.

Who lends not his money at usury and accepts no bribe against the innocent. Whoever does these things shall never be disturbed.

R. The one who does justice will live in the presence of the Lord.


