

A Reflection from our Pastor, Fr. Patrick Riegger...

25th Sunday in Ordinary Time

The Parable of the Dishonest Steward ~ Luke 16:1-13

Today's parable of the dishonest steward is so complex. Most scholars would agree that it raises more questions than answers. There are multiple interpretations when it comes to this passage from Luke. For example, why would Jesus refer positively towards a dishonest steward who used his master's wealth and his master's power to satisfy his own interests at the cost of others when trying to illustrate an important point. One can only imagine. Regardless of His intentions, Jesus is not by any means praising his dishonesty in preparing for his own future with dishonest tactics. He is not justifying the way the steward mismanaged his master's property. Instead, what Jesus is saying to His disciples is that if we are as wise and strategic as this disingenuous steward was in seeking out his own interests, in securing a good spiritual life and a better future with God, we would be on the right path to happiness, something that money cannot buy. We would be ready to inherit the Kingdom of Heaven!


In other words, Jesus wants us to be serious in having a deep spiritual life and a real connection with God in securing a future forever in heaven as this dishonest steward was in securing for his own future surrounded by worldly assets and status. Jesus is asking us to have the same kind of attitude and perseverance that this steward had but in Godly concerns, not earthly gains. We, like this dishonest steward, have to act quickly and wisely with heavenly matters as he was with earthly matters. The difference is, one approach is doomed for destruction, while the other approach prepares us for eternal happiness.

In the end, the dishonest steward had to do what he had to do to survive in this world to ensure a future apart from poverty and shame. The big question for us is what do we need to do to prepare ourselves for something greater? What do we have to do to prepare ourselves for heaven, God's greatest gift to humanity? What kind of strategic planning do we need to put into play in securing a future with God? How eager and motivated are we in securing a future with the Lord forever in heaven as we go about living out our Christian faith?

The truth is, like with this dishonest steward, time is always of essence. The urgency in moving forward is real and essential. With an uncertain future, he had to act decisively and quickly. He had to do what he had to do before it was too late. He had to be prepared to give a full account of his actions when the master returned. What do we have to do to prepare ourselves before our Master requires a full account of our own lives and actions? Perhaps the questions for us to reflect on this week is what do we need to do in securing our future with God forever? What changes do we need to make in our lives now so that we can make more room for God in our hearts? What do

we need to surrender that gets in the way of living a life centered around God?

Again, our Lord is by no means justifying the wrongful behavior or actions of the dishonest steward. Instead, He is just trying to

Being ruthless, greedy or dishonest will not help us inherit the Kingdom of God. But being kind, wise and respectful of one another will help us grow in our own spirituality and prepare us for a more secure life in heaven. We need to make wise decisions in complex and dire situations. We need to look beyond worldly standards and status and look to God more often. We need to be prudent and respectful with one another when it comes to living the Christian life, especially with all the recent violence and chaos in our country. We need to act more wisely and carefully. We need to relate better. We need to pray more often. We need to pray for peace in our world and for the salvation of souls. We need to be more respectful of one another, even if we have differences of opinions. We need to love more and leave judgment up to God. We need to rejoice more in the Lord who is kind and merciful!

I hope you all had a nice summer with your families. Thank you again for your generosity in supporting this year's Summer Appeal. Thank you for all you do throughout the year in support of our parish ministries. St. John's parish is so richly blessed. There are always so many activities going on here each week. I hope you get to take home a bulletin every week or visit our website to see all that is going on in our parish. Hopefully you can join one of our ministries if you're not already involved. I am so happy to be here with my brother priests and deacons. It is so much fun working alongside my staff in serving you and your families. I hope you and your families have a wonderful autumn. 
Women's Group...






Msgr. Ron Richardson:

A Message from Msgr. Walden...

Everyday we have routines, our expectations, and plans. That does not mean everything will happen or work out the way we want or think they should. The key is to keep our focus on who and what is important in our lives. At the end of today's Gospel (Luke 16:1-13), Jesus says: "No servant can serve two masters. either hate one and love the other, or be devoted to one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God mammon." Who of us really likes to think of himself or herself being under the control of a master and answerable to him or her. While people do have expectations of who we are and how we are involved in their lives, we do not readily think of being answerable to them as a master.

Obviously Jesus is opening our minds with those words to see how He is hopeful that we will take Him seriously and, even more than that, to invite Him to be the center and core of our thoughts, words, and actions. He is not an overseeing master looking down and monitoring our every thought, word, and deed. What He is doing is telling us that He is the master. The focus is not on consequences that will occur if we do not listen to Him, take Him seriously, or put Him out of the picture, but on how truly energizing, empowering, and life giving we become when we open our minds and hearts to Him. There is no doubt about His love for us and what He believes we are truly capable of. He is the rock who refused to crumble in the face of rejection and injustice, and the fire of love that refused to be extinguished. In His final words to His disciples in St. Matthew's Gospel (Matthew 28:19-20), Jesus says: "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And



behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age."

Everyday we nurture our faith and one another when we allow Jesus to be the background and foundation of our plans, thoughts, words, and actions. The more we work on that and put our trust in Him and His presence, the more loving our words and actions, the more hopeful our presence, love and concern, and the more powerful His Church and presence are in the world. He is not the overbearing master looking to keep us in line, but our God who created us in His very own image and rejoices when we become His presence to, with, and for each other.

I close with these words from the Last Supper (John 15:10-17) where Jesus assures us that He is far more than an overseeing master, He is our Way, Truth, and Life:

"If you keep my commandments, you will remain in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and remain in his love. I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and your joy may be complete.

This is my commandment: love one another as I love you. No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends. You are my friends if you do what I command you. I no longer call you slaves, because a slave does not know what his master is doing. I have called you friends, because I have told you everything I have heard from my Father. It was not you who chose me, but I who chose you and appointed you to go and bear fruit that will remain, so that whatever you ask the Father in my name he may give you. This I command you: love one another."


