





## **Discussion Questions**

1. Do self-indulgence and wealth necessarily go together? Are indulgences and related complacency related to your ability to hear the cry of the poor?

2. Jesus said to Pilate, "the reason I have come into the world is to bear witness to the truth." What do you do that bears witness to the truth? Do you think, "Lay hold of eternal life" means that you should try to grab eternal life or that you should let God grab you?
