A Message from Our Pastor, Fr. Patrick...

GOSPEL REFLECTION ~ Mark 9:30-37 The Pathway to Happiness

Even though St. Peter did not fully understand what the Messiah would endure in bringing the world redemption, he still knew enough that the Messiah would save humanity from their sins and would accomplish all that God has promised for His people. For Peter, and many at the time, thought the Messiah, the first king of Israel in over six centuries, would liberate Israel from Roman occupation and restore Israel to its former independence. The Jewish people believed that the Messiah would take up His throne in Jerusalem and overthrow the Roman Empire with great force, not by way of the cross and crucifixion. They thought Jesus would restore Israel to its former glory by military, not by humility and service.

It was Peter's confession of faith that we heard about in last week's Gospel that changed everything! It was his profession of faith that was central to Mark's Gospel. His confession of faith was the beginning of the end for Jesus. It was the turning point in Mark's Gospel and the turning point in salvation history. It was a moment of great revelation that Jesus was the answer to God's promise. It began "The Way"- the way to deliverance! This great revelation affirmed to the world that Jesus was on the right side of salvation history. It marked the journey towards Jerusalem where Jesus would deliver us from our sins and reconcile us back to God, that Jerusalem is where all of our hopes and longings would be fulfilled, not by horse and chariot, but by way of the cross and crucifixion.

Jesus says to us today that it is the cross, and our service and love for one another, that saves us. It is the cross and our genuine love for others that leads us to salvation. In today's Gospel, Jesus is addressing those who have some measure of power, privilege and status, and invites all to join Him in a new lifestyle - a lifestyle centered around service, patience and understanding, not greed, envy or power. He clearly states that if we want to be first in His Kingdom, we must be the last of all and servant of all. We must be "child-like," as Jesus says to us elsewhere. We have to be more dependent on God. We need to be open to God and more trusting in God, like a child is. We have to be open to God's ways and place more of our trust in Him, knowing that He shows us the way to new life! Like a child who loves unconditionally, we too must love others the same way.

It is love that frees us! It is in loving that we are transformed! Love unites and love restores. Love brings us closer to God. It is complete and everlasting. Love frees the soul. It is reassuring and embracing and guarantees us a place in heaven. When we love others in the same way in which Christ shows



His love for us, we experience joy and peace in our hearts. Our hearts are free, and our lives are more fulfilling in the Lord.

If we spend more time taking Jesus' teachings seriously, our lives will better. We will be happier and less anxious in life. Love frees us and refreshes the soul. It is the pathway to freedom and our ticket to Paradise. When we fail to love, we fail to remain in God because God is love. And if we want to remain one with God, we have to remain in His love. Love prevails! It is our joy in life and our pathway to happiness, happiness without end!



September! It's Back to School and Religious Formation



September is an exciting time for kids and parents. In academia, students and teachers are starting anew with each other and there is an opportunity to start fresh, regardless of what happened in the past year.

Perhaps your child is starting a new sport or honing skills and advancing to the next level of play. It's also a wonderful time to deepen a youngster's faith.

Effectively engaging in religious formation classes involves both parents and children actively participating and collaborating with the intention

of deepening their understanding of faith and fostering spiritual growth.

Below are some suggestions to help parents ensure their children can get the most out of their religious formation classes:

- Be Actively Involved: Attend parent-teacher meetings, workshops, and events related to the religious formation program. This shows your commitment to your child's spiritual development and allows you to stay informed about their progress.
- ♦ Attend Worship Services: Regularly attend Mass and even add a special prayer service, such as Eucharistic Adoration as a family. This reinforces the connection between what is learned in formation classes and the practice of faith in a community setting.
- Open Communication: Maintain regular communication with your child's religious education teacher or coordinator. Share any concerns, questions, or suggestions you might have. This partnership can enhance your child's formation experience.
- Supplement Learning at Home: Reinforce the lessons learned in class by discussing them at home. Incorporate religious activities, such as reading from scripture, praying together, and participating in family devotions. You do not need all the answers. The pastoral staff at your parish would be happy to meet with you to discuss any thoughts, or questions you may have in understanding Church teachings.
- Model Faith: Children often learn through observation. Demonstrate your faith through your own actions, prayers, and participation in parish ministry.

Religious formation is a lifelong journey. Both parents and children can benefit from ongoing engagement in their parish with an openness to learning, and a commitment to growing in their faith.




Street Ministry



A Message from Msgr. Walden...

It is not so much the question of, "Who can I trust?", as much as, "Who do I trust every single day of my life?" To drive on the highway is to trust that everyone, including myself, will be attentive and obey the traffic laws. When we buy food in the supermarket, we trust the food we buy is fresh and will nourish us. Our innate ability to trust begins in childhood: we know mom and dad will always be there and take care of us. When we start school we trust the teachers we have. As we get older, we become trustworthy and do things that are good and loving on our own initiative. This Sunday and last Sunday, we see Jesus challenging His disciples to trust Him and put their faith in Him. In last Sunday's Gospel (Mark 8:27-35), we saw Jesus asking His disciples, "Who do you say that I am?" St. Peter gives the right answer, but does not know what it means that Jesus is the Christ, the Savior of the world. When Jesus responds to Peter and tells him that he will be rejected, killed, and rise on the third day, Peter rebuked Him. That led Jesus to say to Him, "Get behind me Satan. You are thinking not as God does, but as human beings do." In this Sunday's Gospel (Mark 9:30-37), Jesus says, "The Son of Man is to be handed over to men and they will kill Him, and three days after His death the Son of Man will rise." But they did not understand the saying, and they were afraid to question Him."

What does it mean for us as individuals and as the Church to have faith in Jesus? Who do I, in the depths of my mind and heart, say Jesus is for me and for everyone else? In so many ways, we need the innate, absolute trust that children have in their parents in our trust in Jesus. How far do we let Him into our minds and hearts? How much time and attention do we give Him in prayer, coming to Mass, experiencing His presence in the other Sacraments? St. Peter came to see how much Jesus truly loved him and was patient with him. How do we get to that point? Personal prayer and Mass are essential. In last week's column, I had this quote



from Karl Rahner: "So often I consider my prayer just a job, a duty to be performed. I "get it out of the way" and then relax, glad to have it behind me. When I'm at prayer, I'm at my "duty", instead of being with you." Faith and trust come over time and when we are faithful to God and He is there with us, we find inner peace, hope, courage, and gratitude. We do not have all the answers, but we remain open and committed to being guided by the light only our faith in Jesus brings.

As we read the Gospels, we see Jesus time and again going off to a quiet place to pray. How powerful was His faith in the Father as He prayed with all His heart in the agony in the garden: "He advanced a little and fell prostrate in prayer, saying, 'My Father, if it is possible, let this cup pass from me; yet, not as I will, but as you will'." (Matthew 26:39).

I close with this quote from Pope Benedict XVI that sheds light on Jesus' description of who He is and what He came to do for us:

"The capacity to accept suffering for the sake of goodness, truth, and justice is an essential criterion of humanity, because if my own well-being and safety are ultimately more important than truth and justice, then the power of the stronger prevails, then violence and untruth reign supreme. Truth and justice must stand above my comfort and physical well-being or else my life becomes a lie... To suffer with the other and for others; to suffer for the sake of truth and justice; to suffer out of love and in order to become a person who truly loves - these are the fundamental elements of humanity, and to abandon them would destroy men and woman themselves."

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit as it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. AMEN!




