A Reflection from Deacon Mike...

Today's Gospel portrays a landowner of a vineyard who so wants to get his crop of grapes harvested that he goes out *five different times* in one day searching for workers. With its theme of the last workers receiving the same full day's wage as the first because of the generosity of the owner, it can be easy to overlook the way the parable also symbolizes how eager God is to bring in a great harvest of souls for His Kingdom. Earlier in the Gospel Jesus himself laments that "the harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few" (Matthew 9:37). Why are there so few workers? Because the labor is hard and the greatness of the reward is terribly underappreciated.

Let us for a moment rewrite the parable by combining it with another one, that of the treasure buried in the field. Let us say that there was a landowner who had a field with buried treasure, but he did not know where it was buried, and was eager to hire workers to find it, promising a very generous percentage to the one who found it. And like today's parable, he went out during different times of the day to hire more workers. In this scenario, would you complain if you were hired early and had to work throughout the day's heat? Not at

all, because you would know that you had a much greater chance of finding the treasure and winning the reward. *Simply the promise of a great and wonderful reward changes one's whole outlook on the work it takes to come to possess it.*

There is a hidden treasure and a great and wonderful reward to be found in every Catholic Church. Sadly, too many Catholics have not yet found that treasure because they are too idle or too unwilling to make the effort to find it. That hidden treasure, that great and wonderful reward, is the Eucharist. To find that treasure, one has to believe the promise that it contains a great reward: "He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him up at the last day" (John



6:54). This treasure of the Eucharist is not found without faith. A recent national survey of Catholics found that 69% of Catholics do not believe the Church's teaching on the Eucharist: that through the words of consecration the bread and wine actually become the Body and Blood of Christ. Seven out of ten Catholics thought the Eucharist was only a symbol of Jesus; only 3 out of 10 believed in the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. This reduces the Eucharist to one of the many other symbols of Christ in our faith—the Easter Candle, the Book of the Gospels, the crucifix are all symbols of Jesus Christ. When Jesus at the Last Supper said to the bread in his hands, "This is my Body," and to the wine in the chalice, "This is my Blood," he wasn't making another symbol. He was fulfilling his promise that he would remain with his people until the end of time and providing the food for eternal life. In the Eucharist, Jesus does not want to be symbolized; He wants to be Real. A symbol cannot give eternal life. A symbol cannot raise from the dead. Only the one who is the Resurrection and the Life can do these things. If the Eucharist is not Jesus it is powerless.

Because of the sad and shocking findings of that survey, the bishops of the Catholic Church in America have dedicated 2023-2024 to reviving the faith of Catholics in the Eucharist. We are now in the year of the **EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL**. This Revival has a four-fold purpose: 1) reinvigorate worship of the Eucharist in Mass and Adoration; 2) provide opportunities for every Catholic's personal encounter with Jesus present in the Eucharist; 3) renew and deepen true faith in the Eucharist in every Catholic; 4) strengthen the ability and zeal of Catholics to be witnesses of Eucharistic faith to others. This revival includes both a national Eucharistic Congress and state Eucharistic Congresses. A Eucharistic Congress is a joyful and faith-filled gathering of clergy, religious and lay men and women to celebrate and glorify the Holy Eucharist, and fire up the zeal to spread faith, knowledge and love for the Eucharist to others. Next summer the first National Eucharistic Congress is next month, October 20-22, 2023 at the Our Lady of Martyrs Shrine in Auriesville, NY. Detailed information about both events can be found on our parish website.

The parish of St. John the Evangelist will also be participating in the Eucharistic Revival. A parish committee for the Revival has been formed and is planning a number of programs and events, including: a series of talks explaining the mystery of the Eucharist, special homilies on how to deepen your faith and devotion to the Eucharist, an exhibition on Eucharistic miracles which reflects the work of Blessed Carlo Acutis, and a solemn outdoor Procession with the Blessed Sacrament for the Solemnity of Corpus Christi in June next year. In many ways faith in the Real Presence is already strong in our parish, and the afternoon exposition of the Eucharist in the convent every weekday is always attended by a number of parishioners each day. Yet since those who attend do so regularly, the percentage of parishioners who make time each month to adore Jesus Christ in the Blessed Sacrament is small. Also our parish is not immune from national trends of loss of faith



in the Real Presence, and there are those whose faith in and desire for the Eucharist are weak. We can all fall into the habit of receiving the Eucharist at Mass rather thoughtlessly with insufficient prayer and devotion.

The Eucharist contains a treasure much, much more valuable than a chest of gold buried in a field, but because that treasure—Jesus himself!—is present but hidden under sacramental sign, we can only find it if we exercise and strengthen our faith in what Jesus says so simply, "This is my Body. This is my Blood." The Revival is meant to renew and strengthen every Catholic's faith in and love of our Eucharistic Lord, whether indifferent or fervent. Let us begin to pray that the Holy Spirit change our outlook on the Eucharist so that we become more willing to put in the time and labor needed to search for and find the great treasure of the Eucharist. Let us pray that during this Revival the Lord be merciful and abundant with his graces to Catholics who have drifted away from Mass, or succumbed to the false idea that Jesus is only symbolized by the bread and wine. Let us open our hearts to the love of Christ given to us through the Eucharist, the memorial of his saving death and the sacrament of charity.

May the Eucharistic Revival help all Catholics become more willing to do the faith work of prayer, adoration and learning to find the treasure hidden in the Eucharist. And may the divine love we receive in this Sacrament enflame our hearts with zeal for sharing this Treasure so that our Father, the Land owner, will have the workers He needs to bring in a bountiful harvest of believers into His Kingdom.
