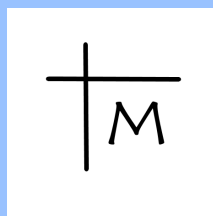
Come bring your entire family – including your four-legged, winged, crawling, and gilled creatures – as we celebrate the feast of St. Francis and our entire parish community!

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The Social Dilemma

TURN OFF ASAP!

Dear Parish Family:

Over the past few weeks, I listen to more and more family members, friends, parishioners, and others who have shared with me a real sense of fear about our country and our world. Someone shared an online “meme” or funny picture. It is a woman squinting with the quote stating, “Me looking outside to see what chapter of Revelation we’re doing today.”

As we look at the past months, you can probably relate to some of those sentiments. From the early days of pandemic and the tragedy of death and sickness so many of us faced or linked to in some way. The changes in lifestyle it caused requiring us to keep distance and space and prevented us from doing so much of “what we do” in order to keep ourselves and others as safe as possible. We see the impact of violence and relate to those who feel they are treated as less than others. We identify with those who seek to keep us safe and are labeled because of the dark actions of a few. We have been called to look at the core issues in our lives related to power, racism, safety, life, and peace. On top of this, we see the potential dangers of climate change and lack of care for our environment and natural resources. Oh...and there’s an election coming up in less than two months and deep divide over the appointment of a new Supreme Court justice.



We see, and perhaps cause or add, more division and divide than I can ever remember in my lifetime (I realize I may just be more aware now). And, at times, not only do we witness to it we have to admit that we are part of it by what we say, what we do (or fail to do), what messages we use, how we use our phones, and what we post and share. The recent Netflix documentary, *The Social Dilemma*, addresses the last concern. The documentary highlights some of the concerns of the world, particularly the virtual world, we find ourselves in during these times. We are so easily manipulated and followed and liked and shared and so on by our action online that we are led to a place of extremes and potentially trapped there. These extremes impact our entire perspective, even our faith and our church.

I received an email from a Franciscan priest I know. He wrote to his congregation the following:

“If you will allow, I recommend for your spiritual practice for the next four months that you impose a moratorium on exactly how much news you are subject to—hopefully not more than an hour a day of television, social media, internet news, magazine and newspaper commentary, and/or political discussions. It will only tear you apart and pull you into the dualistic world of opinion and counter-opinion, not Divine Truth, which is always found in a bigger place.

Instead, I suggest that you use this time for some form of public service, volunteerism, mystical reading from the masters, prayer—or, preferably, all of the above.

You have much to gain now and nothing to lose. Nothing at all.

And the world—with you as a stable center—has nothing to lose.

And everything to gain.”

I’m just starting work on this week’s homily but I am struck by the second son in the Gospel today. He does what we often do, no? He says, “Yes, yes I will do this” and then never follows up. I do that all the time. I say yes I will make this change, commit to this prayer, work on this issue, speak out about this injustice and so on. It usually lasts for a day or, sadly, less. I think I am concerned enough to follow up on this one. More time in prayer at Exposition and in our Chapel here in the Rectory. Less phone. Less social media. Less talking. What about you?

I do not necessarily see things calming down in the weeks ahead. I fear the opposite. I am powerless to a lot of what is happening. I can do what I can to keep those I am in contact with safe (keep distance, wear a mask, etc.). I can try to bring peace where I can and where I am able. I can vote. I can support those working to overcome injustice and those working to keep us safe...and I can step away, even while in the world, and pray. And so can you.

Please say a prayer for me.

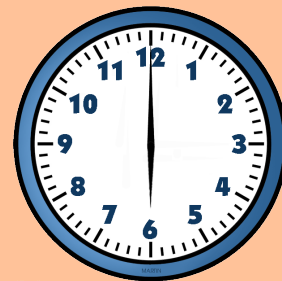

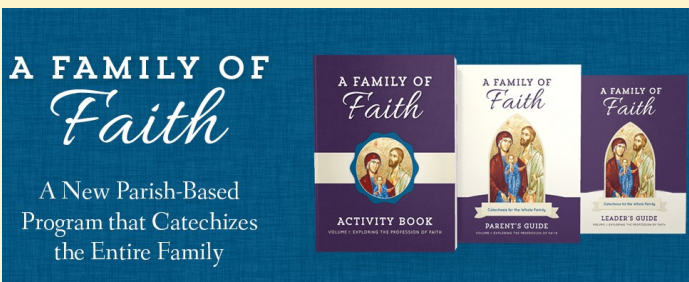


ONLINE REGISTRATION OPEN! INCOMING FIRST GRADERS + NEW STUDENTS:

Parish Social Ministry Updates

Many thanks to the parishioners who have helped Outreach through these COVID-influenced months! As the colder months are setting upon us, the assistance we are asked to provide only increases. We are most grateful for your continued support.

While everyone's life since March has seemed upside down, the poor and marginalized among us have the most difficult task of putting the pieces back together. While it is true that evictions are no longer being carried out and PSEG has been working with clients on their electric bills, many are faced with the uncertainty of unemployment, months of arrears in rent and other bills, and a lack of support and clear communication from the Department of Social Services on when help can be accessed. The following are just some examples of client situations that we've helped with in the past month:

- +Helped pay the mortgage of a family whose father was recently diagnosed with skin cancer.
- +Helped pay the PSEG bill of an 82-year old veteran whose adult daughter is disabled and lives with him.
- +Paid the security payment for permanent housing for a homeless man to move into an apartment

Street Ministry

Our Street Ministry has never stopped visiting the Mastic-Shirley Train Station and we are now bringing out more clothes. Thank you to all of our chefs who have consistently dropped off the meals which we feed the homeless with. We have been receiving a ton of compliments on the food lately. 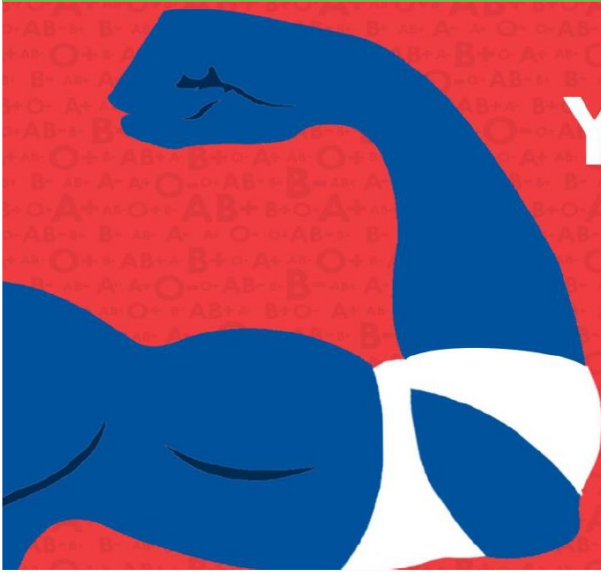

Some Thoughts on Talking to Our Children:

From the Office for the Protection of Children and Young People

Sometimes, talking to our children is...well challenging. Anxious to hear about their day in school, we may pepper them with questions hoping to engage in a conversation. Questions about their day may be responded too with a shake of the head, shrug of the shoulder or worse, a marginal response; "ok" "I don't know" "I guess so" "it was ok." Sometimes conversations need a little push. Remember, conversational skills are learned skills that involve thought, reflection and knowing when to talk and when to listen. By talking with our children, we model and teach these important skills.

Try some conversation openers...simple statements/questions to encourage sharing and some reflection.

- Were you kind to some one today? What did you do? How did you feel after you did it?
- Did somebody do something kind for you today? If so, what did they do? How did you feel?
- Were you thankful for something today? What was it?
- If you could be the teacher, what are some rules you would have?
- Who is your friend in school? What makes that person a good friend?
- What was your favorite part of the day today? Can you tell me about it?
- Who did you talk to in school?

When asking a question that engages your child's imagination, remember there is no right or wrong answer! Time spent talking with your child is an opportunity to support, encourage and affirm your child's unique abilities. A sentence, such as "I noticed you do_____very well" will boost a child's self esteem and strengthen your relationship. Such a statement sends the message that you notice your child's strengths and abilities.

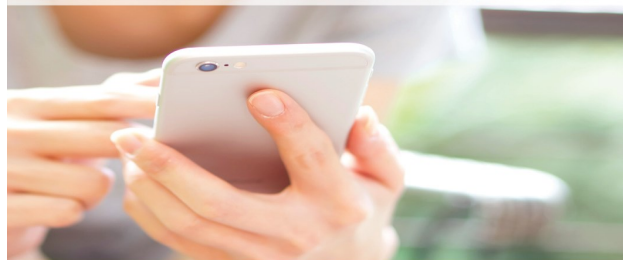
