

# A Reflection from Fr. Francis Lasrado...

#### 26th Sunday in Ordinary Time

The words of Scripture are often words of love and compassion; they are also words of encouragement, joy, and kindness; words of persuasion, egging us on in the right direction, and often coaxing us to a change of heart. Occasionally, they are very challenging. The Scripture readings for this weekend are not gentle nudges; they sound like a divine alarm, and invite us to confront a stark reality: the chasm that separates the rich from the poor, and the even greater chasm we create in our hearts when we ignore the cries of those in need.

The prophet Amos, in our first reading (Amos 6:1a, 4-7), paints a vivid picture of complacency among the wealthy elite of Israel: lounging on ivory beds, feasting on veal and wine, singing idle songs while the poor suffer and the nation crumbles. "Woe to the complacent in Zion!" Amos thunders. Their luxury isn't the sin—it's their indifference. They sing and revel, oblivious to the ruin at their gates. This isn't ancient history; it's what we see today, with billionaires launching rockets while families sleep in the streets, Amos asks: 'Are we the complacent ones, scrolling past the homeless on our way to the next indulgence?'

The responsorial psalm (Psalm 146) offers a counterpoint—a song of praise to the God who "secures justice for the oppressed, gives food to the hungry, and sets captives free." This is the God who lifts up the lowly, protects the widow and orphan, and sustains the stranger. It's a reminder that true power isn't in wealth or status, but in God's faithful love.

In the Gospel (Luke 16:19-31), Jesus, through a haunting parable, presents a powerful and challenging message about

wealth, poverty, and our ultimate destiny. It's the parable of the rich man



and Lazarus. This story is a direct call to examine our hearts and our relationship with the material things of this world. The rich man, unnamed in the parable, is described as living in luxury every single day. He completely overlooks Lazarus, the poor man covered in sores, who lies at his gate, longing for scraps. The rich man's spiritual blindness prevents him from seeing the suffering right outside his door. He lived behind closed doors of wealth and comfort, while Lazarus lay right outside in need. He was indifferent and simply ignored him. He saw Lazarus suffering right in front of him and chose to do nothing; he saw him hungry and he didn't feed him, he saw him naked and didn't clothe him. That was his sin.

The Word of God reminds us: the measure of our faith is not only in prayer and worship, but in how we respond to those in need. This parable asks us: Who is the Lazarus at our gate today? It may be the poor on the street, the lonely neighbor, the sick relative, the migrant, or even someone in our own family who longs for love and attention. To ignore them is to risk losing our way before God.

Saint Paul in our second reading urges us to "pursue righteousness, faith, love, and gentleness." These are the virtues that make us truly rich in God's eyes.

We ought to resolve today to open our eyes and soften our hearts—to see Lazarus, to respond with compassion, and to live as people who reflect the love and mercy of Christ.



school year on Sunday, September 14, 2025 after the 10:00 Mass. Over 350 sandwiches were made!



Did you know that our new Baptism Program is up and running?

Here at St. John's we redesigned our Baptism Preparation program in January 2025. We wanted our program to be warm and welcoming, so we have included more interpersonal communication multiple opportunities for families to come to St. John's prior to the day of Baptism. Our mission is to make St. John's every family's home away from home, where we come together to worship our Almighty God, to learn about our amazing Catholic faith, to dive deeper in our personal relationship with Jesus and grow together as a parish family accepting, loving, supporting and serving each other, our local community and beyond. Baptism preparation program includes the following components:

- \* Registration into the parish as a family
- \* Complete the online Baptism registration for the child who is to be Baptized
- Attend an in-person Baptism
   Preparation class
- \* Complete the online Baptism Belonging video course
- \* Submit all required paperwork

When all requirements have been met, meet with a member of the Baptism Ministry to schedule a date for Baptism.



To be a godparent (or a sponsor for someone who is receiving Confirmation) a Catholic must meet the following requirements. Thes are not "guidelines" here at St. John's. These are the requirements of the universal Catholic Church and are the same all over the world. Different parishes may choose to document these requirements differently. The role of sponsor is an important one!The godparent (sponsor) must be a fully initiated Catholic who supports the person receiving the sacrament through their own example of Catholic living and a desire to help the person learn more about the Catholic faith through prayer, discussion and instruction. The Catholic Church has the following requirements for godparents/sponsors:

- The sponsor must be a fully initiated member of the Catholic Church which means he or she has received the sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist (Communion) and Confirmation.
- The godparent/sponsor must be at least 16 years of age (a person younger than 16 must be fully initiated in the Catholic Church)
- The godparent/sponsor must have an active life of faith in the Catholic Church and provide good example of Catholic Living.
- If the godparent/sponsor is married, he/she must be married in the Catholic Church
- The godparent/sponsor cannot be either parent of the person being Baptized or Confirmed.

Now that you know a little more about Baptism... spread the word! We have a wonderful parish at St. John's and we are growing every day!

# A Message from Msgr. Walden...

How good it feels to be successful in what we undertake. We seek success financially, socially, and in our relationships with one another. In a meditation I read from Pope Benedict XVI last week, I found this thought to contemplate: "Success is definitely not one of the names of God and it is not Christian to eve to outward success have an Seeking and enjoying comfort, as numbers." we see in today's Gospel (Luke 16:9-31) where the rich man dines in comfort and ignores poor Lazarus at his door, can all too easily distract us from being alive and life-giving to one another. In Matthew 8:20 Jesus said: "Foxes have dens and birds of the sky have nests, but the Son of Man has nowhere to rest his head." That is because we are constantly in His heart, hoping we will allow Him to enrich, welcome, and walk with us at every step in our life's journey. He wants to envelope us with His presence and the guidance of the Holy Spirit.

Success is not one of the names of God. Does the cross look like a place of victory? But it is because Jesus remained focused on saving us from life without Him, not on the injustice He suffered and endured on that cross. His purpose was to open our hearts to the merciful, life-giving love of God. In a world that tempts us to seek instant success and satisfaction, there is no greater example of hope than Jesus on the cross. We are all a combination of poor Lazarus and the rich man who ignored him in today's Gospel. As much as we seek to satisfy our needs physically, emotionally, and mentally, peace and hope are only realized when we see and experience the undeniable love, mercy, and hope of Jesus on the cross and humbly open our hearts in gratitude for them.

Jesus said, "the Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many." (Matthew 20:28) Jesus makes it clear that He has come to do what needs to be done out of pure faith, hope, and love. There is no other way we can find the truth of who we are and all we can be without walking with Him in our lives everyday. He carries us in His heart, it is up to



us to really believe that and to live everyday with purpose, hope, love, and mercy. Faith is not just giving God some time every day in prayer and coming to Sunday Mass. It is giving ourselves to Him wholeheartedly as He gives Himself to us and giving ourselves wholeheartedly to one another. There is no such thing as the comfort zone that the rich man in today's Gospel was trying to protect and enjoy. While he knew momentary pleasure, he had no vision or experience of pure gratitude, joy, or love.

I close with the Benedictus prayer I pray every morning from the Breviary.

Blessed be the Lord, the God of Israel;
he has come to his people and set them free.
He has raised up for us a mighty savior,
born of the house of his servant David.
Through his holy prophets he promised of old,
that he would save us from our enemies,
from the hands of all who hate us.
He promised to show mercy to our fathers
and to remember his holy covenant.
This was the oath he swore to our father Abraham,
to set us free from the hands of our enemies,
Free to worship him without fear, holy and righteous
in his sight all the days of our life.
You, my child, shall be called the prophet of the

You, my child, shall be called the prophet of the Most High, for you will go before the Lord to prepare his way, To give his people knowledge of salvation by the forgiveness of their sins. In the tender compassion of our God the dawn from on high shall break upon us, To shine on those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death, and to guide our feet into the way of peace.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit: as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be forever.




## Women's Group...
