FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Director of Music Ministries

Psalm 96:1

Dear Parish Family:

In preparing to write about liturgical music at St. John's, I was struggling to put the words together. Then, we prayed Morning Prayer (I'm writing on Wednesday morning):

"Strike up the instruments, a song to my God with timbrels, a chant to the Lord with cymbals."

"Sing to him a new song, exalt and exclaim his name."

"A new hymn I will sing to you my God..."

"Sing praise for God, sing praise, sing praise to our king, sing praise..."

"Sing praise with all your skill..."

I smiled when I prayed these words from Psalm 47 and Judith 16 because they fit in with what I want to write about today. I want to introduce you to our new Director of Music Ministries, **Mr. Andrew McKeon.** There really is no introduction needed, as Andrew has been a gift to our parish community over the past year. Initially, he "filled in" in a time of great need here last July. Since that time, Andrew has taken on

significantly more responsibility and leadership in this important area of our parish's life.

I am in awe of liturgical musicians. Whether it be a gifted instrumentalist or cantor or choir member, I see not only an ability to "play music" or "sing a song". More than that, they reflect on the gifts God has given them and offer them back to the Lord while helping the rest of us to do the same.

More than being an accomplished organist (and he builds them too!), Andrew has built a community of women and men who lead us in praising God. Because of Andrew's presence this year, we have developed a beautiful ministry of cantors and leaders of song, helped to create a renewed spirit among the music ministers and ministries and started the process of bringing the various music ministries and individuals together. So many of you have shared your happiness with the variety of voices and efforts that have allowed to more fully engage in our communal prayer.

In addition to the gifts he brings to this role, Andrew comes from and has been formed by this community of faith. Andrew and his family are members of our parish. He is a graduate from OLQA. Jane Delassalle encouraged his learning and practicing of the organ. He has been part of the music ministry here at St. John's in different capacities over the past years. For him, I think you have witnessed, this is more than a job or a position in a Church. It's a response to God's presence in the goodness of this community.

This newly created position—the Director of Music Ministries—is an important one in the life of any parish. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops states, "A professional director of music ministries, or music director, provides a major service by working with the bishop or pastor to oversee the planning, coordination, and ministries of the parish or diocesan liturgical music program" (*Sing to the Lord: Music in Divine Worship* 45). In his work, Andrew will be doing many of the things he has done this past year but I expect you will see a lot more happening in the year ahead, both in our signing at Mass and outside of Sunday Mass as well. Andrew will also take on administrative responsibilities for many "behind the scenes" things that often get very little recognition but are crucial. In this position, Andrew will be a member of Pastoral Team that helps to lead our parish community. When you greet Andrew in the days ahead, please welcome him to this new position with the kindness and love that you have welcomed Fr. Michael and myself.

This is a unique time for our parish family for many reasons. The creation of this new position and the presence of Andrew McKeon give us more "reasons for hope" in the year ahead. Indeed this is a good reason for us to "sing a new song to the Lord" (Psalm 96:1).

TOTAL CONSECRATION TO THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

Beginning Sunday, September 10, 2017


Total Consecration to Jesus through Mary is the *quickest, easiest, surest, most perfect way* to become a saint according to St. Louis de Montfort, author of the spiritual classic, *True Devotion to Mary*. Pope St. John Paul II made the consecration at the age of 18 and described it as *the decisive turning point of his life*. Don't you want *that?*

Join the parish community of St. John the Evangelist in making the total consecration to Jesus through Mary. The program will start on September 10th and conclude on October 13th. Why October 13th? October 13th is the 100th anniversary of the Miracle of the Sun during the centenary year of Our Lady's apparitions in Fatima, Portugal. At Fatima, Our Lady promised that, "*In the end, My Heart will triumph.*" I don't know about you, but with the world as crazy as it is, that promise of Our Lady is pretty comforting and reassuring! Why not let Her triumph in your heart and your life?

That's where it has to start!

We will be using the book, 33 Days to Morning Glory, by Fr. Michael Gaitley, MIC. It only takes an open heart to the Lord and a few minutes each day to make your spiritual life never be the same again. The consecration consists of 33 days of preparation leading up to the consecration day itself. You can either do this self-guided retreat alone, with your family in your house or with others from the parish who are making the consecration after the 12pm Mass every weekday and Sunday and the 8am Mass on Saturday morning. There will be a special Mass on October 13th, in which those who are making the consecration may do so together as a parish community.

The parish will provide the book, 33 Days to Morning Glory, for free to those who are interested in participating. (A free will offering may be made but there is no expectation.) You can email Father Michael, stop by the Rectory or see Fr. John, Fr. Michael or one of our sacristans after Sunday Mass.

Vamos a usar el libro, 33 Días Hacía un Glorioso Amanecer, escrito por el Padre Michael Gaitley, MIC. Tú sólo necesitas un corazón abierto al Señor y unos minutos cada día para cambiar tu vida espiritual. Este retiro consiste de 33 días de preparación hasta el día de la Consagración. Puedes hacer este retiro en varias formas; solo, con tu familia o con otras personas en la parroquia, quienes están haciendo la Consagración después de las misas diarias (7am y 12pm). El 13 de octubre, tendremos una misa especial para aquellos que estén haciendo la Consagración junto con la familia parroquial.

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION - Confessions

At St. John's we celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation every day. During the week, we celebrate the sacrament after the 7 a.m. and 12 Noon Masses. Generally, the priests will be in the "living room" or the Chapel area of the Convent. He will wait or be around for 10 minutes after the last person has come. If Daily Mass is held in the Auditorium, the priest will be seated some place in the Auditorium after Mass.

On Saturday and Sunday evenings, confession are heard in the Youth Ministry Office (near the Main Entrance of the Auditorium) or in the back of the Auditorium itself.

With all of our movements in these weeks, we don't want to lose our commitment to and celebration of the sacrament of Reconciliation. (Of course, you can - and should - approach one of our parish priests whenever you want to celebrate the sacrament.)
