A Message from the Director of Faith Formation ...

One of my favorite hobbies is listening to and playing music. (Some of you may remember the days I used to play the drums here at SJE!) How often do we take for granted the gift of hearing, of being able to not only enjoy music, but also to communicate with each other and hear the beauty of the world around us?

In today's Gospel, Jesus teaches us the importance of not only being able to hear physically, but ultimately how to listen to God with open hearts.

"Ephphatha!" Jesus cried out as he healed the deaf man. It means, "Be opened." Jesus is challenging us to *truly listen* to His Word-to be open to the Good News!

There's no doubt this can be challenging. It's often important to think about our approach when it comes to helping those around us listen to the Good News. Are we encouraging and welcoming, or are we using fear as our driving message?

The first reading reminds us to "fear not!" This is one of the most used phrases in the Bible. (One of my favorite hymns is "Be Not Afraid".) Sometimes it's good to take a step back and ask, "Is it fear or love that is motivating my faith?" Are we doing what's right simply out of fear of punishment, or are we willing build a relationship with God through prayer, the Sacraments & openness to growing in our faith?

This week, we remember those affected by the terrorist attacks that occurred in our country on September 11, 2001. The fear & terror of that day may still be fresh for so many who lived through it. Many of us may know people who died, or who are still suffering. As we express gratitude for all the First Responders and heroes of that day and remember those who were lost, we also recall the many ways we worked to overcome the fear that tragedy evoked – we did so through acts of kindness, the bravery of those who led the recovery efforts, and the prayers of so many of us who believed the words spoken by the Prophet Isaiah: "Be strong, fear not! Here is your God...He comes to save you."

In the Office of Faith Formation, we are kicking off our "Fearless" program this weekend, as our 2024 Confirmation candidates join us at our Masses to formally declare their intention to receive this final Sacrament of Initiation and become full members of the Church. We call their Fall preparation program "Fearless" based on 1 John 4:18: *"There is no fear in love, but perfect love drives out fear."* In a society that can often use fear as a motivator, it is important for our young people to know they can turn to God with any fears they may have as they mature and face more of life's challenges.

We're also praying for God's blessings on our families, volunteers and staff as we plan some exciting events for our families as we kick off the rest of our programs later this month!

WHAT'S AHEAD:

•Our "Family of Faith" program for Grades 1-6 will be focusing on the Profession of Faith, with several practical and experiential activities planned for our young people and their parents.

•Our Level 7 & 8 students will be diving into their Bibles and breaking open God's Word as they prepare for the Sacrament of Confirmation.







A Message from Msgr. Walden...

Everyday we are blessed to see with our eyes, hear with our ears, and speak words from our mouths. In the Gospel for today's Mass (Mark 7:31-37) Jesus heals a man who is deaf and mute and those present proclaim: "He has done all things well. He makes the deaf hear and the mute speak." That is quite a contrast to the Gospel of last Monday at Mass (Luke 4:16-30) where after reading the words of Isaiah ("The Spirit of the Lord is upon me because He has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor"), Jesus proclaims He is the fulfillment of that prophecy. The reaction of those who hear these words from Him "rose up, drove Him out of town, and led Him to the brow of the hill on which the town had been built, to hurl Him down headlong. But He passed through their midst and went away."

Where do we hear the words of Jesus in our lives? Of course we literally hear them proclaimed in the readings we have from the Gospels. We also hear them proclaimed by have been entrusted with those who preaching, which is an awesome and very serious responsibility. And when we come right down to it, we are all called and entrusted to live the Word of God in our daily lives. I am reminded of a passage from the Book of Numbers 24:3-4 in the Old Testament we read during Lent where we hear a man named Balaam proclaim about himself: "The oracle of Balaam, son of Beor, the oracle of the man whose eye is true, the oracle of one who hears what God says, and knows what the Most High knows, of one who sees what the Almighty sees, in rapture and with eyes unveiled." What do we as individuals and the Church in the world today have to do to see what God sees, to know what God knows and hear what God says? Surely we are not going to have this hope proclaimed by all the words we read and listen to through the constant bombardment we expose ourselves to in the media. Only when we take our faith seriously do we have the inner strength, peace, hope, and direction that only Jesus can bring into



our minds and hearts. We are always uplifted and enriched when we treat one another with love, which is expressed in listening, speaking, and being attentive and open to one another. That helps us to take the next step which is to speak and listen to Jesus in our prayers which leads to gratitude for His goodness and Holy Spirit. The more Jesus is part of our lives, the more light, hope, and direction in our lives and in our world. Faithful and attentive daily prayer expressed with gratitude, petition, openness, and humility leads us to the hope of Balaam, who sees what God sees, hears what God says, and knows what God knows.

The world today needs the same Savior it has always needed and was given to us 2000 years ago - Jesus Christ! How blessed we are to put our faith and hope in Him and to be loved by Him. How blessed we are to have His presence in the Sacraments and in one another. The challenge is to take the leap of faith with all our heart, soul, mind, and strength.

I close with these simple words from a hymn we sang in my last parish at children's liturgies:

Open My Eyes

Open my eyes, Lord Help me to see your face Open my eyes, Lord Help me to see

Open my ears, Lord Help me to hear your voice Open my ears, Lord Help me to hear

Open my heart, Lord Help me to love like you Open my heart, Lord




